## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 599**

- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Wage and Hour Act; to amend section
   48-1203, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended by section
   1, Initiative Law 2014, No. 425; to provide a minimum wage for
   certain young student workers; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 48-1203, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as
 amended by section 1, Initiative Law 2014, No. 425, is amended to read:

3 48-1203 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section and section
4 48-1203.01, every employer shall pay to each of his or her employees a
5 minimum wage of:

6 (a) Seven dollars and twenty-five cents per hour through December7 31, 2014;

8 (b) Eight dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2015, through
9 December 31, 2015; and

10 (c) Nine dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2016.

(2) For persons compensated by way of gratuities such as waitresses, 11 waiters, hotel bellhops, porters, and shoeshine persons, the employer 12 shall pay wages at the minimum rate of two dollars and thirteen cents per 13 hour, plus all gratuities given to them for services rendered. The sum of 14 wages and gratuities received by each person compensated by way of 15 gratuities shall equal or exceed the minimum wage rate provided in 16 17 subsection (1) of this section. In determining whether or not the individual is compensated by way of gratuities, the burden of proof shall 18 be upon the employer. 19

(3) Any employer employing student-learners as part of a bona fide
vocational training program shall pay such student-learners' wages at a
rate of at least seventy-five percent of the minimum wage rate which
would otherwise be applicable.

(4)(a) Any employer employing young student workers shall pay such
 young student workers wages at a rate of seven dollars and twenty-five
 cents per hour. No more than one-fourth of the total hours paid by the
 employer shall be at the wage rate prescribed in this subsection.

(b) For purposes of this subsection, young student worker means any
 person who (i) is eighteen years of age or younger, (ii) attends any
 public or private high school, and (iii) does not qualify for the wage
 rate prescribed in subsection (3) of this section or section 48-1203.01.
