- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Wage and Hour Act; to amend section
- 2 48-1203, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended by section
- 3 1, Initiative Law 2014, No. 425; to provide a minimum wage for
- 4 certain young student workers; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 48-1203, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as
2 amended by section 1, Initiative Law 2014, No. 425, is amended to read:

3 48-1203 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section and section
4 48-1203.01, every employer shall pay to each of his or her employees a
5 minimum wage of:

6 (a) Seven dollars and twenty-five cents per hour through December
7 31, 2014;

8 (b) Eight dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2015, through
9 December 31, 2015; and

10 (c) Nine dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2016.

11 (2) For persons compensated by way of gratuities such as waitresses,
12 waiters, hotel bellhops, porters, and shoeshine persons, the employer
13 shall pay wages at the minimum rate of two dollars and thirteen cents per
14 hour, plus all gratuities given to them for services rendered. The sum of
15 wages and gratuities received by each person compensated by way of
16 gratuities shall equal or exceed the minimum wage rate provided in
17 subsection (1) of this section. In determining whether or not the
18 individual is compensated by way of gratuities, the burden of proof shall
19 be upon the employer.

20 (3) Any employer employing student-learners as part of a bona fide
21 vocational training program shall pay such student-learners' wages at a
22 rate of at least seventy-five percent of the minimum wage rate which
23 would otherwise be applicable.

24 (4)(a) Any employer employing young student workers shall pay such
25 young student workers wages at a rate of seven dollars and twenty-five
26 cents per hour. No more than one-fourth of the total hours paid by the
27 employer shall be at the wage rate prescribed in this subsection.

28 (b) For purposes of this subsection, young student worker means any
29 person who (i) is eighteen years of age or younger, (ii) attends any
30 public or private high school, and (iii) does not qualify for the wage
31 rate prescribed in subsection (3) of this section or section 48-1203.01.
