LEGISLATIVE BILL 624

Introduced by Larson, 40. Read first time January 21, 2015 Committee: Transportation and Telecommunications
A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Rules of the Road; to amend
section 60-6,301, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
provisions relating to vehicle load requirements; and to repeal the
original section.

5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 60-6,301, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
 is amended to read:

3 60-6,301 When any motor vehicle, semitrailer, or trailer is operated 4 upon the highways of this state carrying a load in excess of the maximum 5 weight permitted by section 60-6,294, the load shall be reduced or 6 shifted to within such maximum tolerance before being permitted to 7 operate on any public highway of this state, except that:

(1) If any motor vehicle, semitrailer, or trailer exceeds the 8 9 maximum load on only one axle, only one tandem axle, or only one group of 10 axles when (a) the distance between the first and last axle of such group of axles is twelve feet or less, (b) the excess axle load is no more than 11 five percent in excess of the maximum load for such axle, tandem axle, or 12 group of axles permitted by such section, while the vehicle or 13 combination of vehicles is within the maximum gross load, and (c) the 14 load on such vehicle is such that it can be shifted or the configuration 15 of the vehicle can be changed so that all axles, tandem axle, or groups 16 17 of axles are within the maximum permissible limit for such axle, tandem axle, or group of axles, such shift or change of configuration may be 18 made without penalty; 19

(2) Any motor vehicle, semitrailer, or trailer carrying only a load 20 of livestock or any agricultural product or commodity may exceed the 21 maximum load as permitted by such section on any only one axle, only one 22 tandem axle, or only one group of axles when the distance between the 23 24 first and last axle of the group of axles is six feet or less if the 25 excess load on the axle, tandem axle, or group of axles is caused by a shifting of the weight of the livestock by the livestock and if the 26 27 vehicle or combination of vehicles is within the maximum gross load as permitted by such section; 28

(3) With a permit issued by the Department of Roads or the Nebraska
State Patrol, a truck with an enclosed body and a compacting mechanism,
designed and used exclusively for the collection and transportation of

garbage or refuse, may exceed the maximum load as permitted by such 1 2 section by no more than twenty percent on only one axle, only one tandem axle, or only one group of axles when the vehicle is laden with garbage 3 4 or refuse if the vehicle is within the maximum gross load as permitted by such section. There shall be a permit fee of ten dollars per month or one 5 hundred dollars per year. The permit may be issued for one or more months 6 7 up to one year, and the term of applicability shall be stated on the permit; 8

9 (4) Any motor vehicle, semitrailer, or trailer carrying any kind of 10 a load, including livestock, which exceeds the legal maximum gross load 11 by five percent or less may proceed on its itinerary and unload the cargo 12 carried thereon to the maximum legal gross weight at the first unloading 13 facility on the itinerary where the cargo can be properly protected. All 14 material so unloaded shall be cared for by the owner or operator of such 15 vehicle at the risk of such owner or operator; and

(5) Any motor vehicle, semitrailer, or trailer carrying grain or 16 17 other seasonally harvested products may operate from the field where such grain or products are harvested to storage, market, or stockpile in the 18 19 field or from stockpile to market or factory up to seventy miles with a load that exceeds the maximum load permitted by section 60-6,294 by 20 fifteen percent on any tandem axle, group of axles, and gross weight. Any 21 22 truck with no more than a single rear axle carrying grain or other 23 seasonally harvested products may operate from the field where such grain or products are harvested to storage, market, or stockpile in the field 24 25 or from stockpile to market or factory up to seventy miles with a load that exceeds the maximum load permitted by section 60-6,294 by fifteen 26 27 on any single axle and gross weight. The owner percent or а representative of the owner of the agricultural product shall furnish the 28 29 driver of the loaded vehicle a signed statement of origin and 30 destination.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to permit to be operated

on the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways any vehicle or
 combination of vehicles which exceeds any of the weight limitations
 applicable to such system as contained in section 60-6,294.

4 If the maximum legal gross weight or axle weight of any vehicle is 5 exceeded by five percent or less and the arresting peace officer or 6 carrier enforcement officer has reason to believe that such excessive 7 weight is caused by snow, ice, or rain, the officer may issue a warning 8 citation to the operator.
