- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to vaccinations; to amend section 71-467,
- 2 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to encourage hospitals
- 3 to offer vaccinations as prescribed; and to repeal the original
- 4 section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 71-467, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2014, is amended to read:
- 3 71-467 (1) Each general acute hospital shall take all of the
- 4 following actions in accordance with the guidelines of the Centers for
- 5 Disease Control and Prevention of the United States Public Health Service
- 6 of the United States Department of Health and Human Services as the
- 7 guidelines existed on January 1, 2013:
- 8 (a) Annually offer onsite influenza vaccinations to all hospital
- 9 employees;
- 10 (b) Offer to all hospital employees a single dose of tetanus-
- 11 diphtheria-pertussis vaccine if they have not previously received such
- 12 vaccine and regardless of the time since their most recent vaccination
- 13 with such vaccine; and
- 14 (c) Require all hospital employees to be vaccinated against
- 15 influenza, tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis, except that an employee
- 16 may elect not to be vaccinated.
- 17 (2) The hospital shall keep a record of which hospital employees
- 18 receive the annual vaccination against influenza and a single dose of
- 19 tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis vaccine and which hospital employees do not
- 20 receive such vaccinations.
- 21 (3) This section shall not apply in individual cases when
- 22 contraindicated or if a national shortage of the vaccine exists.
- 23 (4) Each general acute hospital is encouraged to offer to all
- 24 maternity patients or parents of new babies a single dose of tetanus-
- 25 diphtheria-pertussis vaccine if they have not previously received such
- 26 <u>vaccine and regardless of the time since their most recent vaccination</u>
- 27 with such vaccine.
