- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to public assistance; to amend section
- 2 68-1721, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to eliminate
- a termination date relating to a self-sufficiency contract; and to
- 4 repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 68-1721, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2014, is amended to read:
- 3 68-1721 (1) Under the self-sufficiency contract developed under
- 4 section 68-1719, the principal wage earner and other nonexempt members of
- 5 the applicant family shall be required to participate in one or more of
- 6 the following approved activities, including, but not limited to,
- 7 education, job skills training, work experience, job search, or
- 8 employment.
- 9 (2) Education shall consist of the general education development
- 10 program, high school, Adult Basic Education, English as a Second
- 11 Language, postsecondary education, or other education programs approved
- 12 in the contract.
- 13 (3) Job skills training shall include vocational training in
- 14 technical job skills and equivalent knowledge. Activities shall consist
- 15 of formalized, technical job skills training, apprenticeships, on-the-job
- 16 training, or training in the operation of a microbusiness enterprise. The
- 17 types of training, apprenticeships, or training positions may include,
- 18 but need not be limited to, the ability to provide services such as home
- 19 repairs, automobile repairs, respite care, foster care, personal care,
- 20 and child care. Job skills training shall be prioritized and approved for
- 21 occupations that facilitate economic self-sufficiency.
- 22 (4) The purpose of work experience shall be to improve the
- 23 employability of applicants by providing work experience and training to
- 24 assist them to move promptly into regular public or private employment.
- 25 Work experience shall mean unpaid work in a public, private, for-profit,
- 26 or nonprofit business or organization. Work experience placements shall
- 27 take into account the individual's prior training, skills, and
- 28 experience. A placement shall not exceed six months.
- 29 (5) Job search shall assist adult members of recipient families in
- 30 finding their own jobs. The emphasis shall be placed on teaching the
- 31 individual to take responsibility for his or her own job development and

- 1 placement.
- 2 (6) Employment shall consist of work for pay. The employment may be
- 3 full-time or part-time but shall be adequate to help the recipient family
- 4 reach economic self-sufficiency.
- 5 (7) For purposes of creating the self-sufficiency contract and
- 6 meeting the applicant's work activity requirement, an applicant shall be
- 7 allowed to engage in vocational training that leads to an associate
- 8 degree, a diploma, or a certificate for a minimum of twenty hours per
- 9 week for up to thirty-six months. This subsection terminates on December
- 10 <del>31, 2016.</del>
