- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Rules of the Road; to amend
- 2 sections 60-6,153, 60-6,154, and 60-6,317, Reissue Revised Statutes
- of Nebraska; to provide for the right-of-way for pedestrians; to
- 4 provide and eliminate requirements for persons operating bicycles;
- to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 60-6,153, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
- 2 is amended to read:
- 3 60-6,153 (1) Except at a point where a pedestrian tunnel or overhead
- 4 pedestrian crossing has been provided, when traffic control signals are
- 5 not in place or not in operation, the driver of a vehicle shall yield the
- 6 right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within a crosswalk who
- 7 is in the lane in which the driver is proceeding or is in the lane
- 8 immediately adjacent thereto by bringing his or her vehicle to a complete
- 9 stop.
- 10 (2) No pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other place of
- 11 safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close that
- 12 it is impossible for the driver to stop.
- 13 (3) Whenever any vehicle is stopped at a marked crosswalk or at any
- 14 unmarked crosswalk at an intersection to permit a pedestrian to cross the
- 15 roadway, the driver of any other vehicle approaching from the rear shall
- 16 not overtake and pass such stopped vehicle.
- 17 <u>(4) At or adjacent to the intersection of two highways at which a</u>
- 18 path designated for bicycles and pedestrians is controlled by a traffic
- 19 control signal, a pedestrian who lawfully enters a highway where the path
- 20 <u>crosses the highway shall have the right-of-way within the crossing with</u>
- 21 <u>respect to vehicles and bicycles.</u>
- 22 $(\underline{5} \ 4)$ The Department of Roads and local authorities in their
- 23 respective jurisdictions may, after an engineering and traffic
- 24 investigation, designate unmarked crosswalk locations where pedestrian
- 25 crossing is prohibited or where pedestrians shall yield the right-of-way
- 26 to vehicles. Such restrictions shall be effective only when traffic
- 27 control devices indicating such restrictions are in place.
- 28 Sec. 2. Section 60-6,154, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 29 amended to read:
- 30 60-6,154 (1) Every pedestrian who crosses a roadway at any point
- 31 other than within a marked crosswalk, or within an unmarked crosswalk at

- 1 an intersection, shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the
- 2 roadway.
- 3 (2) Any pedestrian who crosses a roadway at a point where a
- 4 pedestrian tunnel or overhead pedestrian crossing has been provided shall
- 5 yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the roadway.
- 6 (3) Between adjacent intersections at which traffic control signals
- 7 are in operation, pedestrians shall not cross at any place except in a
- 8 marked crosswalk.
- 9 (4) Where a path designated for bicycles and pedestrians crosses a
- 10 highway, a pedestrian who is in the crossing in accordance with the
- 11 <u>traffic control signal shall have the right-of-way within the crossing</u>
- 12 with respect to vehicles and bicycles.
- 13 $(\underline{5}$ 4) No pedestrian shall cross a roadway intersection diagonally
- 14 unless authorized by traffic control devices, and when authorized to
- 15 cross diagonally, pedestrians shall cross only in accordance with the
- 16 traffic control devices pertaining to such crossing movements.
- 17 $(\underline{6} \ 5)$ Local authorities and the Department of Roads, by erecting
- 18 appropriate official traffic control devices, may, within their
- 19 respective jurisdictions, prohibit pedestrians from crossing any roadway
- 20 in a business district or any designated highway except in a crosswalk.
- Sec. 3. Section 60-6,317, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 22 amended to read:
- 23 60-6,317 (1)(a) Any person who operates a bicycle upon a roadway at
- 24 less than the normal speed of traffic at the time and place and under
- 25 conditions then existing shall ride as near to the right-hand curb or
- 26 right-hand edge of the roadway as practicable except when:
- 27 (i a) Overtaking and passing another bicycle or vehicle proceeding
- 28 in the same direction;
- 29 $(\underline{ii} \ b)$ Preparing for a left turn onto a private road or driveway or
- 30 at an intersection;
- 31 (iii e) Reasonably necessary to avoid conditions that make it unsafe

- 1 to continue along the right-hand curb or right-hand edge of the roadway,
- 2 including fixed or moving objects, stopped or moving vehicles, bicycles,
- 3 pedestrians, animals, or surface hazards;
- 4 (iv d) Riding upon a lane of substandard width which is too narrow
- 5 for a bicycle and a vehicle to travel safely side by side within the
- 6 lane; or
- 7 $(\underline{v} \ e)$ Lawfully operating a bicycle on the paved shoulders of a
- 8 highway included in the state highway system as provided in section
- 9 60-6,142.
- 10 <u>(b)</u> Any person who operates a bicycle upon a roadway with a posted
- 11 speed limit of thirty-five miles per hour or less on which traffic is
- 12 restricted to one direction of movement and which has two or more marked
- 13 traffic lanes may ride as near to the left-hand curb or left-hand edge of
- 14 the roadway as practicable. Whenever a person operating a bicycle leaves
- 15 the roadway to ride on the paved shoulder or leaves the paved shoulder to
- 16 enter the roadway, the person shall clearly signal his or her intention
- 17 and yield the right-of-way to all other vehicles.
- 18 (2) No bicyclist shall suddenly leave a curb or other place of
- 19 safety and walk or ride into the path of a vehicle which is so close that
- 20 <u>it is impossible for the driver to stop.</u>
- 21 $(\underline{3} \ 2)$ Any person who operates a bicycle upon a highway shall not
- 22 ride more than single file except on paths or parts of highways set aside
- 23 for the exclusive use of bicycles.
- 24 (3) Except as provided in section 60-6,142, whenever a usable path
- 25 for bicycles has been provided adjacent to a highway, a person operating
- 26 <u>a bicycle shall use such path and shall not use such highway.</u>
- 27 (4) A person who is operating a bicycle on a path designated for
- 28 <u>bicycles and who lawfully enters a highway where the path crosses the</u>
- 29 <u>highway shall have the right-of-way within the crossing with respect to</u>
- 30 any vehicle. A bicyclist who enters a crossing with the traffic control
- 31 <u>signal</u> is <u>lawfully</u> entering the <u>highway</u>. Nothing in this <u>subsection</u>

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1 <u>relieves the bicyclist or the driver of a vehicle from the duty to</u>

- 2 <u>exercise care.</u>
- 3 $(\underline{5} \ 4)$ A local authority may by ordinance further regulate the
- 4 operation of bicycles and may provide for the registration and inspection
- 5 of bicycles.
- 6 Sec. 4. Original sections 60-6,153, 60-6,154, and 60-6,317, Reissue
- 7 Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
