- Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska, 4

1	Section 1. <u>The Adult Career Pathways Task Force is created. The</u>
2	purpose of the task force is to develop recommendations for connecting
3	adult basic education programs to career pathways in high-demand
4	occupations and sectors and connecting to work in the Department of Labor
5	and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the State Department of
6	Education, including work conducted as a part of the federal Workforce
7	Innovation and Opportunity Act, 29 U.S.C. 3101 et seq., as such act
8	<u>existed on January 1, 2016.</u>
9	Sec. 2. (1) The executive committee of the Adult Career Pathways
10	Task Force shall consist of the following voting members:
11	(a) The chairperson of the Education Committee of the Legislature;
12	<u>(b) The chairperson of the Business and Labor Committee of the</u>
13	<u>Legislature;</u>
14	<u>(c) A member of the Legislature who is also a commissioner on the</u>
15	Midwest Higher Education Compact; and
16	<u>(d) Three additional members of the Legislature, appointed by the</u>
17	Executive Board of the Legislative Council.
18	<u>The voting members of the executive committee shall choose a</u>
19	chairperson and vice-chairperson from among the voting members.
20	(2) The Commissioner of Labor, the Commissioner of Education, the
21	Director of Economic Development, the Director of Correctional Services,
22	and the executive director of the Coordinating Commission for
23	Postsecondary Education, or their designees, shall be nonvoting, ex
24	officio members of the executive committee of the task force.
25	(3) The remaining members of the task force shall be nonvoting
26	members appointed by the executive committee of the task force through an
27	application and selection process and shall include representatives of
28	<u>(a) advocacy groups with research or policy expertise in adult basic</u>
29	education programs and career pathways, (b) educational institutions, (c)
30	the philanthropic community, (d) local chambers of commerce, (e) service
31	providers who offer adult basic education programs, and (f) the business

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1 community in high-demand occupations or sectors that the task force has 2 identified for potential career pathways. Members of the task force 3 appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be reimbursed for their 4 actual and necessary expenses as members of such task force as provided 5 in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177.

Sec. 3. <u>The Adult Career Pathways Task Force shall:</u>

7 (1) Review and analyze student transition from adult basic education, English language learner, and general educational development 8 9 programs to career pathways, including: Alignment of programming; rates 10 of student progression to postsecondary education; the coordination and communication between adult basic education programs and postsecondary 11 educational institutions; the coordination and communication between 12 13 adult basic education programs and programs operated by the Department of Labor or the Department of Economic Development; supportive services for 14 15 students; barriers to student advancement; and the use of integrated instruction, bridge programs, and career pathways; 16

17 (2) Review and analyze adult basic education programs currently administered by the State Department of Education, community colleges in 18 19 Nebraska, and other adult basic education program providers identified by the task force, with focus provided on: The missions and goals of the 20 21 various adult basic education programs; the accessibility of adult basic 22 education programs; the types of credentials offered; the degree of state and federal funding invested in programming and instruction; the age and 23 24 educational functioning of students at time of entry into the adult basic 25 education program and the rates of gain upon completion; barriers to student advancement or completion of adult basic education; the rate of 26 27 students that continue to high school equivalency or postsecondary 28 education upon completion; innovative models or curriculum for combining adult basic education and credit courses; and the degree to which the 29 adult basic education program partners with job training providers, 30 postsecondary education programs, or employers; 31

1	<u>(3) Review and analyze high school equivalency in Nebraska,</u>
2	including: The rate of students that continue to postsecondary education
3	upon completing the general educational development program; and barriers
4	to student advancement or completion of the general educational
5	<u>development program;</u>
6	(4) Develop common performance definitions and measures that adult
7	basic education programs, general educational development programs, and
8	postsecondary educational institutions will use to track student
9	progress, including, but not limited to, (a) successful completion of a
10	<u>general educational development program, a diploma of high school</u>
11	<u>equivalency, or a high school diploma, (b) employment placement, (c)</u>
12	entrance into postsecondary education or training, (d) other credential
13	completion, and (e) retention in postsecondary education or employment
14	six months post-enrollment or placement; and
15	(5) Analyze existing professional development opportunities for
16	adult educators and develop a strategy for addressing any identified gaps
17	related to connecting adult education learners to career pathways.
18	Sec. 4. <u>In order to accomplish its duties, the Adult Career</u>
19	<u>Pathways Task Force may:</u>
20	<u>(1) Request and receive from any state or local governmental entity</u>
21	or institution information relating to adult basic education, including,
22	but not limited to, reports, data, projections, and statistics; and
23	(2) Appoint special committees to advise and assist the task force.
24	Members of any such special committee shall be appointed by the
25	chairperson of the task force and may be members of the task force or
26	individuals from the private or public sector. A special committee shall
27	report to the task force on the progress of the special committee.
28	Members of a special committee appointed under this section may not
29	receive reimbursement or pay for work done in relation to the special
30	<u>committee.</u>

31 Sec. 5. (1) On or before December 15, 2017, the Adult Career

1	Pathways Task Force shall submit a preliminary report, and on or before
2	December 15, 2018, the task force shall submit a final report (a) to the
3	Governor and (b) electronically to the Executive Board of the Legislative
4	<u>Council.</u>
5	(2) The preliminary report and final report shall:
6	<u>(a) Include the recommendations required pursuant to section 1 of</u>
7	<u>this act;</u>
8	<u>(b) Describe how the task force fulfilled its statutory purposes and</u>
9	duties during the time period covered by the report; and
10	(c) Contain recommendations on how the state can:
11	<u>(i) Better align adult basic education, high school equivalency, and</u>
12	postsecondary education with career pathways;
13	<u>(ii) Better align adult basic education with programs within the</u>
14	Department of Labor, the Department of Economic Development, and the
15	Department of Correctional Services;
16	<u>(iii) Improve professional development opportunities for adult basic</u>
17	educators relative to connecting adult basic education learners to career
18	pathways;
19	<u>(iv) Increase the number of skilled employees in Nebraska in order</u>
20	to meet the employment needs of high-demand occupations or sectors; and
21	(v) Increase the number of students completing adult basic education
22	and general educational development programs and transitioning to
23	postsecondary education.
24	Sec. 6. The Adult Career Pathways Task Force terminates on December

25 <u>31, 2018.</u>
