- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Public Transportation Act; to
- 2 amend sections 13-1209, 13-1210, and 13-1212, Reissue Revised
- 3 Statutes of Nebraska; to authorize state financial assistance for
- 4 capital acquisition costs as prescribed; to harmonize provisions;
- 5 and to repeal the original sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 13-1209, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 2 amended to read:
- 3 13-1209 (1) A public transportation assistance program is hereby
- 4 established to provide state assistance for the capital acquisition and
- 5 <u>operating costs</u> operation of public transportation systems.
- 6 (2) Any municipality, county, transit authority, or qualified
- 7 public-purpose organization shall be eligible to receive financial
- 8 assistance for the eligible <u>capital acquisition and</u> operating costs of a
- 9 public transportation system, whether the applicant directly operates
- 10 such system or contracts for its operation. A qualified public-purpose
- 11 organization shall not be eligible for financial assistance under the
- 12 Nebraska Public Transportation Act if such organization is currently
- 13 receiving state funds for a program which includes transportation
- 14 services and such funding and services would be duplicated by the act.
- 15 Eligible operating costs shall include those expenses incurred in the
- 16 operation of a public transportation system which exceed the amount of
- 17 operating revenue and which are not otherwise eligible for reimbursement
- 18 from any available federal programs other than those administered by the
- 19 United States Department of the Treasury. Eligible capital acquisition
- 20 costs include planning, engineering, designing, and evaluating transit
- 21 projects and other technical transportation-related studies, and capital
- 22 investments in: (a) Buses and bus-related activities, such as replacing,
- 23 <u>overhauling</u>, and rebuilding buses; (b) installing crime prevention and
- 24 <u>security equipment; and (c) constructing and maintaining passenger</u>
- 25 <u>facilities</u>.
- 26 (3) The state grant to an applicant shall not exceed fifty percent
- 27 of the eligible <u>capital acquisition or</u> operating costs of the public
- 28 transportation system as provided for in subsection (2) of this section.
- 29 The amount of state funds shall be matched by an equal amount of local
- 30 funds in support of capital acquisition or operating costs.
- 31 Sec. 2. Section 13-1210, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 2 13-1210 (1) The Department of Roads shall annually certify the
- 3 amount of capital acquisition and operating costs eligible for funding
- 4 under the public transportation assistance program established under
- 5 section 13-1209.
- 6 (2) The department shall submit an annual report to the chairperson
- 7 of the Appropriations Committee of the Legislature on or before December
- 8 1 of each year regarding funds requested by each applicant for eligible
- 9 <u>capital acquisition and operating</u> costs in the current fiscal year
- 10 pursuant to subsection (2) of section 13-1209 and the total amount of
- 11 state grants projected to be awarded in the current fiscal year pursuant
- 12 to the public transportation assistance program. The report submitted to
- 13 the committee shall be submitted electronically. The report shall
- 14 separate into two categories the requests and grants awarded for
- 15 handicapped vans, otherwise known as paratransit vehicles, and requests
- 16 and grants awarded for handicapped-accessible fixed-route bus systems.
- 17 Sec. 3. Section 13-1212, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 18 amended to read:
- 19 13-1212 (1) The Department of Roads shall administer sections
- 20 13-1209 to 13-1212, and may adopt and promulgate issue such rules and
- 21 regulations pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act as are
- 22 necessary, including but not limited to defining eligible capital
- 23 <u>acquisition and operating costs</u>, establishing contractual and other
- 24 requirements including standardized accounting and reporting
- 25 requirements, which shall include the applicant's proposed service area,
- 26 the type of service proposed, all routes and schedules, and any further
- 27 information needed for recipients to ensure insure the maximum feasible
- 28 coordination and use of state funds, establishing application procedures,
- 29 and developing a policy for apportioning funds made available for this
- 30 program should they be insufficient to cover all eligible projects.
- 31 Priority on the allocation of all funds shall be given to those proposed

projects best suited to serve the needs of the elderly and handicapped and to proposed projects with federal funding participation.

- 3 (2) Any public-purpose organization proposing to provide public transportation denied financial assistance as a result of a determination 4 5 by the Department of Roads that an area is adequately served by existing transportation services may submit a petition to the department 6 7 requesting the department to reclassify the proposed service area as not 8 being adequately served by existing public transportation services. The 9 petition submitted to the department by the public-purpose organization shall bear the signatures of at least fifty registered voters residing in 10 the proposed service area. Upon receipt of the petition the department 11 shall hold a public hearing in the proposed service area and after such 12 hearing shall determine whether the proposed service area is already 13 adequately served. In carrying out its duties under this section the 14 department shall comply with the provisions of the Administrative 15 16 Procedure Act. The department shall not be required to conduct a reevaluation hearing for an area more frequently than once a year. 17
- Sec. 4. Original sections 13-1209, 13-1210, and 13-1212, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
