1	Section 1. Section 68-901, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015, is
2	amended to read:
3	68-901 Sections 68-901 to 68-975 <u>and section 2 of this act</u> shall be
4	known and may be cited as the Medical Assistance Act.
5	Sec. 2. <u>(1)(a) Any provider with a high categorical risk level as</u>
6	determined by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services or the
7	medicaid assistance program established pursuant to the Medical
8	Assistance Act shall be subject to a fingerprint-based criminal history
9	record information check.
10	<u>(b) Such provider who is an individual, or any individual with at</u>
11	least a five percent direct or indirect ownership interest in any such
12	provider, shall provide his or her fingerprints to the Nebraska State
13	Patrol. The Nebraska State Patrol shall undertake a search for
14	fingerprint-based criminal history record information relating to such
15	provider, including transmittal of the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau
16	of Investigation for a national fingerprint-based criminal history record
17	information check.
18	(c) The fingerprint-based criminal history record information check
19	shall include information concerning the provider from federal
20	repositories of such information and repositories of such information in
21	other states, if authorized by federal law.
22	(d) The Nebraska State Patrol shall issue a report to the department
23	that includes the fingerprint-based criminal history record information
24	concerning the provider.
25	(e) The provider or individual being screened shall pay the actual
26	cost of the fingerprinting and fingerprint-based criminal history record
27	information check.
28	(2) The department shall maintain a record of the results of the
29	fingerprint-based criminal history record information check.
30	(3) The department may deny or terminate the enrollment of:
31	(a) Any provider who is an individual who does not pass the national

2	<u>(b) Any provider in which an individual with at least a five percent</u>
3	direct or indirect ownership interest in the provider does not pass the
4	national fingerprint-based criminal history record information check.
5	<u>Criteria for not passing the fingerprint-based criminal history record</u>
6	<u>information check includes at least the following: (i) Any criminal</u>
7	conviction within the last ten years related to the provider's
8	involvement with the federal Health Insurance for the Aged Act, 42 U.S.C.
9	<u>1305 et seq., any program or assistance set forth in Chapter 68, or the</u>
10	federal Children's Health Insurance Program established pursuant to 42
11	U.S.C. 1397aa, as such act, laws, and section existed on January 1, 2016;
12	or (ii) any conviction involving fraudulent activities.
13	Sec. 3. Original section 68-901, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015,
14	is repealed.

15 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when 16 passed and approved according to law.
