- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to license plates; to amend sections 60-3,122
- 2 and 60-3,124, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to eliminate
- additional fees for Pearl Harbor and disabled veteran plates; and to
- 4 repeal the original sections.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-3,122, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,

- 2 is amended to read:
- 3 60-3,122 (1) Any person may, in addition to the application required
- 4 by section 60-385, apply to the department for license plates designed by
- 5 the department to indicate that he or she is a survivor of the Japanese
- 6 attack on Pearl Harbor if he or she:
- 7 (a) Was a member of the United States Armed Forces on December 7,
- 8 1941;
- 9 (b) Was on station on December 7, 1941, during the hours of 7:55
- 10 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. Hawaii time at Pearl Harbor, the island of Oahu, or
- offshore at a distance not to exceed three miles;
- 12 (c) Was discharged or otherwise separated with a characterization of
- 13 honorable from the United States Armed Forces; and
- 14 (d) Holds a current membership in a Nebraska Chapter of the Pearl
- 15 Harbor Survivors Association.
- 16 (2) The license plates shall be issued upon the applicant paying the
- 17 regular license fee and an additional fee of five dollars and furnishing
- 18 proof satisfactory to the department that the applicant fulfills the
- 19 requirements provided by subsection (1) of this section. The additional
- 20 fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Nebraska
- 21 Veteran Cemetery System Operation Fund. Any number of motor vehicles,
- 22 trailers, semitrailers, or cabin trailers owned by the applicant may be
- 23 so licensed at any one time. Motor vehicles and trailers registered under
- 24 section 60-3,198 shall not be so licensed.
- 25 (3) If the license plates issued pursuant to this section are lost,
- 26 stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the plates shall be issued
- 27 replacement license plates upon request and without charge.
- 28 Sec. 2. Section 60-3,124, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 29 amended to read:
- 30 60-3,124 (1) Any person who is a veteran of the United States Armed
- 31 Forces, who was discharged or otherwise separated with a characterization

- 1 of honorable or general (under honorable conditions), and who is
- 2 classified by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs as one
- 3 hundred percent service-connected disabled may, in addition to the
- 4 application required in section 60-385, apply to the Department of Motor
- 5 Vehicles for license plates designed by the department to indicate that
- 6 the applicant is a disabled veteran. The inscription on the license
- 7 plates shall be D.A.V. immediately below the license plate number to
- 8 indicate that the holder of the license plates is a disabled veteran.
- 9 (2) The plates shall be issued upon the applicant paying the regular
- 10 license fee and an additional fee of five dollars and furnishing proof
- 11 satisfactory to the department that the applicant is a disabled veteran.
- 12 The additional fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to
- 13 the Nebraska Veteran Cemetery System Operation Fund. Any number of motor
- 14 vehicles, trailers, semitrailers, or cabin trailers owned by the
- 15 applicant may be so licensed at any one time. Motor vehicles and trailers
- 16 registered under section 60-3,198 shall not be so licensed.
- 17 (3) If the license plates issued under this section are lost,
- 18 stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the plates shall be issued
- 19 replacement license plates as provided in section 60-3,157.
- Sec. 3. Original sections 60-3,122 and 60-3,124, Reissue Revised
- 21 Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
