- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska County and City Lottery Act;
  to amend section 9-650, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to
  provide for segregation of keno funds, electronic fund transfers,
  and deposit of gross proceeds by a sales outlet location as
  prescribed; to provide powers and duties for the Department of
  Revenue and the Tax Commissioner; and to repeal the original
  section.

1 Section 1. Section 9-650, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 2 amended to read:
- 3 9-650 (1) The gross proceeds of any lottery, less the amount
- 4 awarded in prizes and any salary, fee, or commission paid to a licensed
- 5 lottery operator plus any interest on such funds, shall be segregated
- 6 from any other revenue and placed in a separate account of the lottery
- 7 operator and the county, city, or village. If a lottery operator is
- 8 conducting a lottery on behalf of a county, city, or village, such
- 9 proceeds, including any interest, shall be transferred from the lottery
- 10 operator's separate account to a separate account of the county, city, or
- 11 village. Any interest received by a county, city, or village from the
- 12 proceeds of the lottery shall be used solely for community betterment
- 13 purposes.
- 14 (2) During the hours that keno is conducted at a sales outlet
- 15 location, cash constituting the starting bank of the lottery operator
- 16 conducting the keno game and cash receipts from the sale of keno tickets
- 17 shall be segregated from all other revenue of the sales outlet location.
- 18 Subject to the adoption and promulgation of rules and regulations by the
- 19 <u>department setting forth recordkeeping and reporting criteria for lottery</u>
- 20 operators, counties, cities, and villages that request authorization from
- 21 the department for the use of electronic transfers from satellite
- 22 locations, cash receipts from the sale of keno tickets shall remain
- 23 segregated from all other revenue of the sales outlet location until
- 24 deposited in the bank account of the sales outlet location, lottery
- 25 operator, county, city, or village. Such bank account shall be designated
- 26 <u>by the lottery operator, county, city, or village.</u>
- 27 <u>(3) The Tax Commissioner may authorize the electronic tr</u>ansfer of
- 28 funds from the nonsegregated general business account of a sales outlet
- 29 <u>location to the bank account of a lottery operator, county, city, or</u>
- 30 village as long as such funds are transferred no later than five business
- 31 days following the day the funds were collected. To facilitate the

- 1 electronic transfer of such funds to a lottery operator, county, city, or
- 2 <u>village that has met the requirements of the rules and regulations</u>
- 3 adopted and promulgated pursuant to subsection (2) of this section, a
- 4 sales outlet location may first deposit such funds into a non-segregated
- 5 general business account of the sales outlet location.
- 6 (4) The gross proceeds of any lottery, less the amount awarded in
- 7 prizes, which are collected by a sales outlet location shall be deposited
- 8 into the account of the sales outlet location, lottery operator, county,
- 9 city, or village no later than five business days following the day such
- 10 gross proceeds were collected.
- 11 (5) Separate records shall be maintained by such licensed county,
- 12 city, or village. Records required by the Nebraska County and City
- 13 Lottery Act shall be preserved for at least three years unless otherwise
- 14 provided by rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the
- 15 department. Any law enforcement agency or other agency of government
- shall have the authority to investigate the records relating to lotteries
- 17 and gross proceeds from such lottery at any time. Any county, city, or
- 18 village shall, upon proper written request, deliver all such records to
- 19 the department or other law enforcement agency for investigation.
