- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Foster Care Review Act; to amend
- 2 section 43-1303, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017; to change
- 3 reporting requirements for the Foster Care Review Office; to
- 4 harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 43-1303, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 43-1303 (1) The office shall maintain the statewide register of all
- 4 foster care placements occurring within the state, and there shall be a
- 5 weekly report made to the registry of all foster care placements by the
- 6 Department of Health and Human Services, any child-placing agency, or any
- 7 court in a form as developed by the office in consultation with
- 8 representatives of entities required to make such reports. For each child
- 9 entering and leaving foster care, such report shall consist of
- 10 identifying information, placement information, the plan or permanency
- 11 plan developed by the person or court in charge of the child pursuant to
- 12 section 43-1312, and information on whether any such child was a person
- 13 immune from criminal prosecution under subsection (5) of section 28-801
- 14 or was considered a trafficking victim as defined in section 28-830. The
- 15 department, the Office of Probation Administration, and every court and
- 16 child-placing agency shall report any foster care placement within three
- 17 working days. The report shall contain the following information:
- 18 (a) Child identification information, including name, date of birth,
- 19 gender, race, religion, and ethnicity;
- 20 (b) Identification information for parents and stepparents,
- 21 including name, address, and status of parental rights;
- (c) Placement information, including initial placement date, current
- 23 placement date, and the name and address of the foster care placement;
- 24 (d) Court status information, including which court has
- 25 jurisdiction, initial custody date, court hearing date, and results of
- 26 the court hearing;
- 27 (e) Agency or other entity having custody of the child; and
- 28 (f) Case worker, probation officer, or person providing direct case
- 29 management or supervision functions.
- 30 (2)(a) The Foster Care Review Office shall designate a local board
- 31 to conduct foster care file audit case reviews for each case of children

- 1 in foster care placement.
- 2 (b) The office may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for
- 3 the following:
- 4 (i) Establishment of training programs for local board members which
- 5 shall include an initial training program and periodic inservice training
- 6 programs;
- 7 (ii) Development of procedures for local boards;
- 8 (iii) Establishment of a central record-keeping facility for all
- 9 local board files, including foster care file audit case reviews;
- 10 (iv) Accumulation of data and the making of annual reports on
- 11 children in foster care placements. Such reports shall include, but not
- 12 be limited to, (A) personal data on length of time in foster care, (B)
- 13 number of placements, (C) frequency and results of foster care file audit
- 14 case reviews and court review hearings, (D) number of children supervised
- 15 by the foster care programs in the state annually, (E) trend data
- 16 impacting foster care, services, and placements, (F) analysis of the
- 17 data, and (G) recommendations for improving the foster care system in
- 18 Nebraska;
- 19 (v) Accumulation of data and the making of quarterly reports
- 20 regarding the children in foster care placements;
- 21 (vi) To the extent not prohibited by section 43-1310, evaluation of
- 22 the judicial and administrative data collected on foster care and the
- 23 dissemination of such data to the judiciary, public and private agencies,
- 24 the department, and members of the public; and
- 25 (vii) Manner in which the office shall determine the appropriateness
- 26 of requesting a court review hearing as provided for in section 43-1313.
- 27 (3) A local board shall send a written report to the office for each
- 28 foster care file audit case review conducted by the local board. A court
- 29 shall send a written report to the office for each foster care review
- 30 hearing conducted by the court.
- 31 (4)(a) (4) The office shall report and make recommendations to the

- 1 Legislature, the department, the Office of Probation Administration, the
- 2 courts, local boards, and county welfare offices.
- 3 <u>(b)</u> Such reports and recommendations shall include, but not be
- 4 limited to, the annual judicial and administrative data collected on
- 5 foster care pursuant to subsections (2) and (3) of this section and the
- 6 annual evaluation of such data.
- 7 <u>(c)</u> The report and recommendations submitted to the Legislature
- 8 shall be submitted electronically. In addition, the Foster Care Review
- 9 Office shall provide copies of such reports and recommendations to each
- 10 court having the authority to make foster care placements.
- 11 $\underline{\text{(d)}}$ The executive director of the office shall $\frac{\text{also}}{\text{also}}$ provide
- 12 <u>reports</u>, at a time specified by the Health and Human Services Committee
- 13 of the Legislature, regular electronic updates regarding child welfare
- 14 <u>and juvenile justice</u> data and information <u>on March 1, June 1, September</u>
- 15 1, and December 1. The September 1 report at least quarterly, and a
- 16 fourth-quarter report which shall be the annual report. The executive
- 17 director shall provide additional reports at a time specified by the
- 18 Health and Human Services Committee of the Legislature. The reports shall
- 19 include issues, policy concerns, and problems which have come to the
- 20 <u>attention of the office</u>, and the executive director from analysis of the
- 21 data. The <u>reports</u> executive director shall recommend alternatives to the
- 22 identified problems and related needs of the office and the foster care
- 23 system to the committee. The reports and recommendations submitted to the
- 24 <u>Legislature shall be submitted electronically.</u>
- 25 (e) The Health and Human Services Committee shall coordinate and
- 26 prioritize data and information requests submitted to the office by
- 27 members of the Legislature.—The annual report of the office shall be
- 28 completed by December 1 each year and shall be submitted electronically
- 29 to the committee.
- 30 (5) The executive director of the office or his or her designees
- 31 from the office may visit and observe foster care facilities in order to

- 1 ascertain whether the individual physical, psychological, and
- 2 sociological needs of each foster child are being met.
- 3 (6) At the request of any state agency, the executive director of
- 4 the office or his or her designees from the office may conduct a case
- 5 file review process and data analysis regarding any state ward or ward of
- 6 the court whether placed in-home or out-of-home at the time of the case
- 7 file review.
