LEGISLATIVE BILL 1052

Committee: Education

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to require instruction as
- 2 prescribed for students who exhibit characteristics of dyslexia; to
- 3 provide duties for the State Board of Education; and to provide
- 4 duties for teacher education programs.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) Beginning with the 2018-19 school year, unless
- 2 <u>otherwise provided in an individualized education plan for a student</u>
- 3 receiving special education services, each student who is identified as
- 4 exhibiting characteristics of dyslexia shall receive evidence-based
- 5 structured literacy instruction implemented with fidelity using a
- 6 multisensory approach as provided in the technical assistance document
- 7 for dyslexia adopted and promulgated by the State Department of Education
- 8 pursuant to section 2 of this act.
- 9 (2) A school district shall not require a student who exhibits
- 10 <u>characteristics of dyslexia to obtain a medical diagnosis to receive</u>
- 11 intervention pursuant to this section.
- 12 Sec. 2. <u>The State Department of Education shall develop and</u>
- 13 distribute a technical assistance document for dyslexia. The technical
- 14 assistance document shall provide information about the characteristics
- 15 of dyslexia, associated conditions of dyslexia, indicators of dyslexia,
- 16 and the screening, progress monitoring, evaluation, instruction, and
- 17 intervention for dyslexia. The technical assistance document shall also
- 18 provide guidance for evidence-based structured literacy instruction to be
- 19 <u>implemented with fidelity using a multisensory approach for students who</u>
- 20 are identified as exhibiting characteristics of dyslexia. Such document
- 21 shall be distributed to all teacher education programs, educational
- 22 service units, and school districts to create statewide awareness among
- 23 educators. The document shall also be referenced in the rules and
- 24 regulations of the department regarding approval of teacher education
- 25 programs, special education, and accreditation of schools.
- Sec. 3. On and after July 1, 2019, each teacher education program
- 27 approved by the State Board of Education shall include as a part of their
- 28 initial program course requirements instruction in dyslexia, including,
- 29 but not limited to:
- 30 (1) Knowledge and best practice standards for teaching reading;
- 31 (2) Characteristics of dyslexia and the science of dyslexia; and

2 <u>accommodations</u>, and assistive technology for individuals with dyslexia.
