## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 1053**

A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Legislature; to amend sections 50-1401,
 50-1402, 50-1403, and 50-1404, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska;
 to provide for a ten-year strategic plan; to restate intent; to
 provide powers and duties for the Legislature's Planning Committee;
 to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 50-1401, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

3 50-1401 The Legislature finds and declares that:

(1) State government has significant challenges to face. An ever-4 5 changing global economy, an aging population, outmigration of educated young people, and constantly expanding needs for services, among other 6 issues, require that the Legislature consider the long-term trends and 7 affecting the welfare of Nebraskans 8 factors and the long-term 9 implications of the decisions made by the members of the Legislature;

10 (2) It is necessary for the Legislature to identify emerging trends,
11 assets, and challenges of the state;

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(3) It is vital for Nebraska to have continuity in policy;

13 (4) It is necessary to establish a process of long-term state
14 planning within the Legislature and to have a ten-year strategic plan for
15 <u>the State of Nebraska to guide such planning;</u> and

16 (5) It is the duty of the Legislature to assess the long-range needs17 of Nebraska and to adopt legislation which meets those needs.

Sec. 2. Section 50-1402, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

50-1402 The Legislature's Planning Committee is hereby established 20 as a special legislative committee to exercise the authority and perform 21 the duties provided in sections 50-1401 to 50-1404 for in this section. 22 The committee shall be comprised of the Speaker of the Legislature, the 23 24 chairperson of the Executive Board of the Legislative Council, the chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the Legislature, and six 25 other members of the Legislature to be chosen by the Executive Board of 26 the Legislative Council. The executive board shall ensure that the 27 28 Legislature's Planning Committee includes adequate geographic representation. The chairperson and vice-chairperson of the committee 29 shall be elected by majority vote of the committee. The committee shall 30 be subject to all rules prescribed by the Legislature. The initial 31

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members of the committee shall be appointed as soon as possible after May 14, 2009, and thereafter the committee shall be appointed at the beginning of each regular legislative session and shall meet as needed. The committee shall have staff support from the various legislative divisions and staff.

Sec. 3. Section 50-1403, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
amended to read:

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50-1403 The Legislature's Planning Committee shall:

9 (1) Collect and analyze data about Nebraska, including, but not 10 limited to, demographics, workforce, education, wages, wealth, tax 11 structure, revenue, natural resources, assets, challenges, trends, and 12 growth and efficiency of government;

13 (2) Identify long-term issues significant to the state <u>and develop a</u>
 14 <u>ten-year strategic plan as provided in section 5 of this act;</u>

15 (3) Set goals and benchmarks;

16 (4) Issue a yearly report of its findings; and

17 (5) Propose legislation.

18 Sec. 4. Section 50-1404, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 19 amended to read:

20 50-1404 In order to fulfill its duties, the Legislature's Planning
21 Committee may:

22 (1) Hold public hearings;

(2) Obtain data and information from <u>and consult with state</u>
 agencies, the University of Nebraska, and private entities that contract
 with the state;

(3) Contract for assistance, including consultants, with the
 approval of the Executive Board of the Legislative Council, to develop
 and evaluate the ten-year strategic plan as provided in section 5 of this
 act; and

30 (4) Exercise any other authority or powers as granted from time to31 time by the executive board.

2	<u>Committee shall report to the Legislature and the Governor regarding the</u>
3	<u>development of a ten-year strategic plan for the State of Nebraska. The</u>

5	benchmarks established in the strategic plan. The committee shall reissue
6	<u>the ten-year strategic plan every ten years based on the two-year</u>
