LEGISLATIVE BILL 1071

Introduced by Lindstrom, 18. Read first time January 17, 2018 Committee: Revenue

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to public utilities; to adopt the 2 Infrastructure Improvement and Replacement Assistance Act; and to
- 2 Infrastructure Improvement and Replacement Assistance Act; and to
- 3 create a fund.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. <u>Sections 1 to 4 of this act shall be known and may be</u>
2	cited as the Infrastructure Improvement and Replacement Assistance Act.
3	Sec. 2. (1) The Legislature finds that municipalities and sewer and
4	water utilities of this state face a need to construct, upgrade,
5	redevelop, and replace sewer and water infrastructure facilities and to
6	redevelop and replace obsolete water facilities. By providing sewer and
7	water facilities, municipalities provide the building blocks for economic
8	development. Not only does the investment in infrastructure generate an
9	immediate stream of economic activity, it also lays the groundwork for
10	private investment that will use the facilities so provided.
11	Municipalities and sewer and water utilities in this state currently are
12	in critical need of assistance in providing these facilities. Political
13	subdivisions are limited in their ability to finance major infrastructure
14	projects. Political subdivisions are able to use property taxes, local
15	option sales taxes, bond funding, fees for services, or a combination
16	thereof. However, many of these financing options contain statutory
17	budget and tax levy restrictions. In order to minimize the burden on
18	property taxpayers in Nebraska, the Legislature finds that it is fair and
19	equitable to encourage the use of fees for services to finance major
20	<u>infrastructure projects.</u>

21 (2) The Legislature further finds that it is in the public interest to assist municipalities and sewer and water utilities by establishing a 22 23 turnback of state sales tax revenue to provide funds to municipalities 24 and sewer and water utilities to be used to replace and redevelop sewer 25 and water infrastructure facilities and to redevelop and replace obsolete 26 sewer and water piping facilities. In order that this state and its 27 residents may receive long-term economic and fiscal benefits from such 28 facilities, a need exists to provide state assistance to municipalities 29 and sewer and water utilities endeavoring to construct, acquire, substantially reconstruct, expand, operate, improve, or equip such 30 31 facilities. It is in the best interest of the state, its municipalities,

1 and its sewer and water utilities that the state assist municipalities 2 and sewer and water utilities in financing the construction, acquisition, 3 substantial reconstruction, expansion, operation, improvement, or 4 equipping of sewer and water infrastructure facilities. 5 The state shall assist municipalities and sewer and water Sec. 3. utilities by turning back XXX percent of the state sales tax revenue 6 7 collected on sewer and potable water fees by the state to the municipalities and sewer and water utilities to assist in infrastructure 8 9 replacement costs to construct, upgrade, redevelop, and replace sewer and 10 water infrastructure facilities on a per capita percentage directly to each participating political subdivision or utility based on state sales 11 12 tax paid. 13 Sec. 4. For purposes of the Infrastructure Improvement and 14 Replacement Assistance Act: (1) Political subdivision means any local governmental body formed 15 16 and organized under state law and any joint entity or joint public agency 17 created under the Interlocal Cooperation Act or the Joint Public Agency Act which has statutory authority to issue general obligation bonds; 18 19 (2) Water utility means any water utility operated by a political

<u>(3) Sewer utility means any sewer utility operated by a political</u>
<u>subdivision.</u>
