- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend sections 79-760.01,
- 2 79-760.02, and 79-760.03, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 3 2016; to change provisions for academic content standards; to
- 4 provide for model measurable academic content standards covering
- financial literacy and entrepreneurship; to change school district
- 6 duties; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
- 7 sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 79-760.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 2 Supplement, 2016, is amended to read:
- 3 79-760.01 (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt measurable
- 4 academic content standards for at least the grade levels required for
- 5 statewide assessment pursuant to section 79-760.03. The standards shall
- 6 cover the subject areas of reading, writing, mathematics, science, and
- 7 social studies. The standards adopted shall be sufficiently clear and
- 8 measurable to be used for testing student performance with respect to
- 9 mastery of the content described in the state standards. The State Board
- 10 of Education shall develop a plan to review and update standards for each
- 11 subject area every seven years. The state board plan shall include a
- 12 review of commonly accepted standards adopted by school districts.
- 13 (2) The State Board of Education shall adopt model measurable
- 14 <u>academic content standards covering financial literacy and</u>
- 15 entrepreneurship for either the elementary, middle, and high school grade
- 16 ranges or a selected grade in each of such grade ranges at a minimum.
- 17 Such model standards shall include, but not be limited to, budgeting,
- 18 investing, insurance, taxes, debt management, and interest for the
- 19 financial literacy standards and business planning, financing, and
- 20 operations for the entrepreneurship standards. The model standards
- 21 adopted pursuant to this subsection shall be sufficiently clear and
- 22 measurable to be used for testing student performance with respect to
- 23 mastery of the content described in such standards. The State Board of
- 24 Education shall develop a plan to review and update such model standards
- 25 every seven years.
- Sec. 2. Section 79-760.02, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 27 2016, is amended to read:
- 79-760.02 (1) In accordance with timelines that are adopted by the
- 29 State Board of Education, but in no event later than one year following
- 30 the adoption or modification of state standards pursuant to subsection
- 31 (1) of section 79-760.01, each school district shall adopt measurable

- 1 quality academic content standards in the subject areas of reading,
- 2 writing, mathematics, science, and social studies. The standards may be
- 3 the same as, or may be equal to or exceed in rigor, the measurable
- 4 academic content standards adopted by the state board and shall cover at
- 5 least the same grade levels. School districts may work collaboratively
- 6 with educational service units, with learning communities, or through
- 7 interlocal agreements to develop such standards.
- 8 (2) Each school district may adopt measurable quality academic
- 9 content standards in subject areas and grade levels not included in
- 10 subsection (1) of this section. Such standards may be, but are not
- 11 required to be, the same as any model measurable academic content
- 12 standards adopted by the State Board of Education. School districts may
- 13 work collaboratively with educational service units, with learning
- 14 <u>communities</u>, or through interlocal agreements to develop measurable
- 15 quality academic content standards for adoption pursuant to this section.
- 16 Sec. 3. Section 79-760.03, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 17 2016, is amended to read:
- 18 79-760.03 (1) For school year 2009-10 and each school year
- 19 thereafter, the State Board of Education shall implement a statewide
- 20 system for the assessment of student learning based on the measurable
- 21 academic content standards adopted pursuant to subsection (1) of section
- 22 79-760.01 and for reporting the performance of school districts and
- 23 learning communities pursuant to this section. The assessment and
- 24 reporting system shall measure student knowledge of subject matter
- 25 materials covered by measurable academic content standards selected by
- 26 the state board.
- 27 (2) The state board shall adopt a plan for an assessment and
- 28 reporting system and implement and maintain the assessment and reporting
- 29 system according to such plan. The plan shall be submitted annually to
- 30 the State Department of Education, the Governor, the chairperson of the
- 31 Education Committee of the Legislature, and the Clerk of the Legislature.

- 1 The plan submitted to the committee and the Clerk of the Legislature
- 2 shall be submitted electronically. The state board shall select grade
- 3 levels for assessment and reporting required pursuant to subsections (4)
- 4 through (7) of this section. The purposes of the system are to:
- 5 (a) Determine how well public schools are performing in terms of
- 6 achievement of public school students related to the measurable state
- 7 academic content standards adopted pursuant to subsection (1) of section
- 8 <u>79-760.01</u>;
- 9 (b) Report the performance of public schools based upon the results
- 10 of state assessment instruments and national assessment instruments;
- 11 (c) Provide information for the public and policymakers on the
- 12 performance of public schools; and
- 13 (d) Provide for the comparison among Nebraska public schools and the
- 14 comparison of Nebraska public schools to public schools elsewhere.
- 15 (3) The Governor shall appoint a technical advisory committee to
- 16 review (a) the statewide assessment plan, (b) state assessment
- 17 instruments, and (c) the accountability system developed under the
- 18 Quality Education Accountability Act. The technical advisory committee
- 19 shall consist of three nationally recognized experts in educational
- 20 assessment and measurement, one administrator from a school in Nebraska,
- 21 and one teacher from a school in Nebraska. The members shall serve terms
- 22 of three years, except that two of the members shall be appointed for
- 23 initial terms of two years. Any vacancy shall be filled by the Governor
- 24 for the remainder of the term. One of the members shall be designated as
- 25 chairperson by the Governor. Members shall be reimbursed for their actual
- 26 and necessary expenses as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177. The
- 27 committee shall advise the Governor, the state board, and the State
- 28 Department of Education on the development of statewide assessment
- 29 instruments and the statewide assessment plan. The appointments to the
- 30 committee shall be confirmed by the Legislature.
- 31 (4) Through school year 2016-17, the state board shall prescribe a

- 1 statewide assessment of writing that relies on writing samples in each of
- 2 three grades selected by the state board. Each year at least one of the
- 3 three selected grades shall participate in the statewide writing
- 4 assessment with each selected grade level participating at least once
- 5 every three years.
- 6 (5) For school year 2009-10 and for each school year thereafter, the
- 7 state board shall prescribe a statewide assessment of reading. The
- 8 statewide assessment of reading shall include assessment instruments for
- 9 each of the grade levels three through eight and for one grade in high
- 10 school and shall measure student performance based on the measurable
- 11 academic content standards adopted by the state board pursuant to section
- 12 79-760.01. For school year 2017-18 and each school year thereafter, the
- 13 statewide assessment of reading shall include a component of writing as
- 14 determined by the state board.
- 15 (6) For no later than school year 2010-11 and for each school year
- 16 thereafter, the state board shall prescribe a statewide assessment of
- 17 mathematics. The statewide assessment of mathematics shall include
- 18 assessment instruments for each of the grade levels three through eight
- 19 and for one grade in high school and shall measure student performance
- 20 <u>based on the measurable academic content</u>standards adopted by the state
- 21 board pursuant to section 79-760.01.
- 22 (7) For no later than school year 2011-12 and each school year
- 23 thereafter, the state board shall prescribe a statewide assessment of
- 24 science. The statewide assessment of science shall include assessment
- 25 instruments for each of the grade levels selected by the state board and
- 26 <u>shall measure student performance based on the measurable academic</u>
- 27 <u>content</u> standards adopted by the state board pursuant to section
- 28 79-760.01. The grade levels shall include at least one grade in
- 29 elementary school, one grade in middle school or junior high school, and
- 30 one grade in high school.
- 31 (8) The department shall conduct studies to verify the technical

- 1 quality of assessment instruments and demonstrate the comparability of
- 2 assessment instrument results required by the act. The department shall
- 3 annually report such findings to the Governor, the Legislature, and the
- 4 state board. The report submitted to the Legislature shall be submitted
- 5 electronically.
- 6 (9) The state board shall recommend national assessment instruments
- 7 for the purpose of national comparison. Beginning with school year
- 8 2017-18, the state board shall select a national assessment instrument
- 9 that is also used as a standard college admission test which shall be
- 10 administered to students in the eleventh grade in every public high
- 11 school in each school district. Each school district shall report
- 12 individual student data for scores and sub-scores according to procedures
- 13 established by the state board and the department pursuant to section
- 14 79-760.05.
- 15 (10) The aggregate results of assessment instruments and national
- 16 assessment instruments shall be reported by the district on a building
- 17 basis to the public in that district, to the learning community
- 18 coordinating council if such district is a member of a learning
- 19 community, and to the department. Each learning community shall also
- 20 report the aggregate results of any assessment instruments and national
- 21 assessment instruments to the public in that learning community and to
- 22 the department. The department shall report the aggregate results of any
- 23 assessment instruments and national assessment instruments on a learning
- 24 community, district, and building basis as part of the statewide
- 25 assessment and reporting system.
- 26 (11)(a) The assessment and reporting plan shall:
- 27 (i) Provide for the confidentiality of the results of individual
- 28 students; and
- 29 (ii) Include all public schools and all public school students.
- 30 (b) The state board shall adopt criteria for the inclusion of
- 31 students with disabilities, students entering the school for the first

- 1 time, and students with limited English proficiency.
- 2 The department may determine appropriate accommodations for the
- 3 assessment of students with disabilities or any student receiving special
- 4 education programs and services pursuant to section 79-1139. Alternate
- 5 academic achievement standards in reading, mathematics, and science and
- 6 alternate assessment instruments aligned with the standards may be among
- 7 the accommodations for students with severe cognitive disabilities.
- 8 (12) The state board may select additional grade levels, subject
- 9 areas, or assessment instruments for statewide assessment consistent with
- 10 federal requirements.
- 11 (13) The state board shall not require school districts to
- 12 administer assessments or assessment instruments which are not consistent
- 13 with the act.
- 14 (14) The state board may appoint committees of teachers, from each
- 15 appropriate subject area, and administrators to assist in the development
- 16 of statewide assessment instruments required by the act.
- 17 Sec. 4. Original sections 79-760.01, 79-760.02, and 79-760.03,
- 18 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016, are repealed.
