- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to teachers; to adopt the Alternative
 Certification for Quality Teachers Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. <u>Sections 1 to 4 of this act shall be known and may be</u>
2	cited as the Alternative Certification for Quality Teachers Act.
3	Sec. 2. The Legislature finds and declares that:
4	<u>(1) Like many other states, Nebraska is facing a teacher and</u>
5	<u>substitute teacher shortage;</u>
6	(2) Mandatory training days and family leave policies draw many
7	regular teachers out of their classrooms, causing schools to hire
8	<u>substitute teachers;</u>
9	(3) The Internal Revenue Service requires a separation period for
10	recently retired teachers who may otherwise be interested in returning to
11	<u>the classroom as a substitute teacher;</u>
12	(4) In the fall of 2016, the State Department of Education conducted
13	a teacher vacancy survey of all 450 school districts, educational service
14	units, and nonpublic school systems;
15	(5) Such survey showed that the state continues to have hundreds of
16	unfilled teaching positions across the state;
17	<u>(6) The most widely reported solutions for filling teaching</u>
18	vacancies were to hire an individual who holds a transitional,
19	provisional, or temporary teaching certificate; and
20	(7) Filling teaching vacancies and having an adequate number of
21	substitute teachers is imperative for delivering a high quality learning
22	<u>experience to students.</u>
23	Sec. 3. (1) In addition to certificates issued pursuant to sections
24	79-806 to 79-815, a certificate to teach in the public schools shall be
25	granted by the State Board of Education to any person in good standing
26	who possesses a valid teaching certificate from another state and who
27	annually completes the requirements to maintain either the certification
28	from such other state or certification pursuant to rules and regulations
29	<u>of the board.</u>
30	(2) Issuance of a certificate to teach in the public schools
31	pursuant to this section shall be subject to a criminal history record

<u>information check pursuant to section 79-814.01 and any rules and</u>
 <u>regulations adopted and promulgated by the board to carry out this</u>
 <u>section.</u>
 Sec. 4. (1) In addition to certificates issued pursuant to sections
 79-806 to 79-815, a temporary certificate to teach in the public schools

6 <u>may be granted by the State Board of Education to any person who has:</u>

7 (a) Presented to the board a valid bachelor's degree, or higher,
 8 from an accredited degree-awarding college or university;

9 (b) Passed the basic skills examination and appropriate subject area
 10 examination as designated by the board; and

11 (c) Enrolled in an alternative teacher certification program 12 approved by the board.

13 (2) Any temporary certificate to teach in the public schools issued 14 pursuant to this section shall be valid for a period not to exceed two 15 years, during which the holder of such temporary certificate must obtain 16 a valid certificate to teach in the public schools through an alternative 17 teacher certification program approved by the board.

18 (3) Issuance of a temporary certificate to teach in the public 19 schools pursuant to this section shall be subject to a criminal history 20 record information check pursuant to section 79-814.01 and any rules and 21 regulations adopted and promulgated by the board to carry out this 22 section.

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
