- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to public safety officials; to adopt the In
- the Line of Duty Compensation Act; and to provide an operative date.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 5 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 <u>cited as the In the Line of Duty Compensation Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the In the Line of Duty Compensation Act:
- 4 (1) Compensation administrator means the person responsible for
- 5 accepting claims and paying compensation pursuant to the act. For
- 6 firefighters, the compensation administrator shall be the State Fire
- 7 Marshal. For law enforcement officers, the compensation administrator
- 8 shall be the Superintendent of Law Enforcement and Public Safety;
- 9 (2) Firefighter means a member of a paid or volunteer fire
- 10 department in Nebraska, including a member of a rescue squad associated
- 11 <u>with a paid or volunteer fire department in Nebraska, and a member of an</u>
- 12 <u>emergency medical services ambulance squad;</u>
- 13 (3)(a) Killed in the line of duty means losing one's life as a
- 14 result of an injury received on or after the operative date of this act
- 15 in the active performance of duties as a law enforcement officer or
- 16 firefighter if the death occurs within one year from the date the injury
- 17 was received and if that injury arose from violence or other accidental
- 18 cause.
- 19 <u>(b) Killed in the line of duty excludes death resulting from the</u>
- 20 <u>willful misconduct or intoxication of the law enforcement officer or</u>
- 21 <u>firefighter; and</u>
- 22 (4) Law enforcement officer means (a) any person who is responsible
- 23 for the prevention or detection of crime or the enforcement of the penal,
- 24 traffic, or highway laws of the State of Nebraska or any political
- 25 subdivision of the state for more than one hundred hours per year and who
- 26 is authorized by law to make arrests, (b) any state correctional
- 27 employee, or (c) any county correctional employee.
- Sec. 3. (1) If a law enforcement officer or firefighter is killed
- 29 in the line of duty, compensation shall be paid as provided in the In the
- 30 Line of Duty Compensation Act to recognize the ultimate sacrifice made by
- 31 such law enforcement officer or firefighter.

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1 (2) The amount of compensation to be paid under the act shall be as

- 2 <u>follows:</u>
- 3 (a) For deaths occurring during calendar year 2018, the amount of
- 4 such compensation shall be fifty thousand dollars; and
- 5 (b) For deaths occurring in calendar year 2019 and each calendar
- 6 year thereafter, the amount of such compensation shall be equal to the
- 7 compensation amount from the previous calendar year increased by the
- 8 percentage increase, if any, in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban
- 9 Consumers, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau
- 10 <u>of Labor Statistics, for the twelve months ending on June 30 of such</u>
- 11 previous calendar year.
- 12 <u>(3) The person entitled to receive such compensation shall be</u>
- 13 <u>determined as follows:</u>
- 14 <u>(a) If the law enforcement officer or firefighter designated a</u>
- 15 person to receive the compensation, the compensation shall be paid to the
- 16 <u>designated person;</u>
- 17 (b) If no person is designated by the law enforcement officer or
- 18 firefighter or if the designated person is not alive at the death of the
- 19 law enforcement officer or firefighter, the compensation shall be paid in
- 20 <u>accordance with a legally binding will left by the law enforcement</u>
- 21 <u>officer or firefighter; or</u>
- 22 (c) If no person is designated by the law enforcement officer or
- 23 firefighter or the designated person is not alive at the death of the law
- 24 <u>enforcement officer or firefighter and the law enforcement officer or</u>
- 25 firefighter did not leave a legally binding will, the compensation shall
- 26 be paid as follows:
- 27 (i) If there is a surviving spouse, the entire sum shall be paid to
- 28 <u>the surviving spouse;</u>
- 29 <u>(ii) If there is no surviving spouse but there is a surviving</u>
- 30 <u>descendant</u> of the decedent, the entire sum shall be paid to the
- 31 decedent's descendants per stirpes;

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- 1 (iii) If there is neither a surviving spouse nor a surviving
- 2 <u>descendant of the decedent, the entire sum shall be paid to the surviving</u>
- 3 parents of the decedent in equal parts or, if there is only one surviving
- 4 parent, the entire sum shall be paid to such surviving parent; or
- 5 (iv) If there is no surviving spouse, surviving descendant of the
- 6 <u>decedent</u>, or surviving parent of the decedent, but there is a surviving
- 7 brother or sister of the decedent, or a descendant of a brother or
- 8 <u>sister, who was receiving his or her principal support from the decedent</u>
- 9 at the decedent's death, the entire sum shall be paid to the dependent
- 10 <u>brother or sister or dependent descendant of a brother or sister. If</u>
- 11 <u>multiple persons would qualify under this subdivision, the entire sum</u>
- 12 <u>shall be paid in equal parts to those that qualify.</u>
- 13 <u>(4) If there is no person to whom compensation is payable under</u>
- 14 <u>subsection (3) of this section, no compensation shall be paid under the</u>
- 15 <u>In the Line of Duty Compensation Act.</u>
- 16 <u>(5) No part of the compensation may be paid to any person not listed</u>
- in subsection (3) of this section.
- 18 Sec. 4. (1) To receive compensation under the In the Line of Duty
- 19 Compensation Act, a claim for the compensation must be made by filing an
- 20 application with the compensation administrator within one year after the
- 21 date of death of the law enforcement officer or firefighter who was
- 22 <u>killed in the line of duty. Such application shall be on a form</u>
- 23 prescribed by the compensation administrator and shall include:
- 24 (a) The name, address, and title or position of the law enforcement
- 25 officer or firefighter who was killed in the line of duty;
- 26 (b) The name and address of the person or persons designated by the
- 27 law enforcement officer or firefighter to receive the compensation and,
- 28 if more than one, the percentage or share to be paid to each such person.
- 29 If there has been no such designation, the application shall include the
- 30 name and address of the persons to whom compensation is payable under
- 31 subsection (3) of section 3 of this act;

- 1 (c) A full, factual account of the circumstances resulting in or the
- 2 <u>course of events causing the death of the law enforcement officer or</u>
- 3 <u>firefighter; and</u>
- 4 (d) Such other information as the compensation administrator
- 5 reasonably requires.
- 6 (2) The compensation administrator shall send written notice to all
- 7 claimants within two weeks after the initiation of a claim indicating
- 8 whether or not the application is complete. For purposes of this
- 9 <u>subsection</u>, an application is complete if a claimant has submitted to the
- 10 compensation administrator all documents and information required under
- 11 <u>subsection (1) of this section. If a claimant's application is</u>
- 12 incomplete, the compensation administrator shall include in the written
- 13 notice a list of the documents or information which the claimant must
- 14 submit in order for the application to be complete. If a claimant's
- 15 application is complete, the compensation administrator shall make an
- 16 investigation of the matters set forth in the application. Upon
- 17 completion of such investigation, and no later than forty-five days after
- 18 receipt of a complete application, the compensation administrator shall
- 19 send written notice to the claimant stating whether the claim has been
- 20 approved or denied. If a claim is denied, the notice shall include the
- 21 reason or reasons for the denial. Such denial may be appealed, and the
- 22 appeal shall be in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. If a
- 23 claim is approved, the compensation administrator shall pay compensation
- 24 to the claimants entitled to such compensation in accordance with the In
- 25 the Line of Duty Compensation Act.
- 26 Sec. 5. The State Fire Marshal and Superintendent of Law
- 27 <u>Enforcement and Public Safety may adopt and promulgate rules and</u>
- 28 regulations to carry out the In the Line of Duty Compensation Act.
- 29 Sec. 6. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2018.
