- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to tourism; to amend sections 81-3702, 2 81-3710, 81-3712, 81-3713, 81-3721, and 81-3724, Reissue Revised 3 Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 81-3701, 81-3703, 81-3711, 4 81-3714, and 81-3725, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016; to restate intent; to define a term; to change membership provisions 5 6 for the Nebraska Tourism Commission; to provide for districts; to 7 provide, change, and eliminate powers and duties; to eliminate obsolete provisions; to change and eliminate provisions relating to 8 9 contracts; to provide for additional grants; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original sections; to outright repeal 10 section 81-3727, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016; and 11 to declare an emergency. 12
- 13 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 81-3701, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2016, is amended to read:

81-3701 Sections 81-3701 to 81-3726 and section 4 of this act shall
be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Visitors Development Act.

7 81-3702 The purposes of the Nebraska Visitors Development Act are (1) to create the Nebraska Tourism Commission to promote Nebraska as a 8 tourism destination and to administer programs a commission and a fund to 9 10 provide general promotional activity, solicitation, and an operating program to attract an increasing number of visitors to Nebraska and 11 further the use of travel and tourism facilities in Nebraska, (2) to 12 provide for a lodging tax on hotels for the purpose of establishing a 13 State Visitors Promotion Cash Fund, and (3) to authorize the governing 14 body of any county to appoint a visitors committee and impose a lodging 15 tax on hotels for the purpose of establishing a County Visitors Promotion 16 17 Fund and a County Visitors Improvement Fund.

Tourism industry includes any person or other entity, 23 Sec. 4. 24 whether for-profit or not-for-profit, that promotes an activity, an 25 event, or a site which attracts both instate and out-of-state visitors, including, but not limited to, a chamber of commerce, a convention and 26 visitors bureau, the hospitality industry, the food and beverage 27 industry, the hotel industry, a passenger transportation provider, any 28 business or organization engaged in recreational, historical, cultural, 29 artistic, or entertainment pursuits, and any person who owns or operates 30 any such activity, event, or site. 31

81-3710 (1) The Nebraska Tourism Commission is created. The terms of 3 the members serving pursuant to subsection (2) of this section terminate 4 thirty days after the effective date of this act. The terms of the 5 members serving pursuant to subsection (3) of this section begin thirty 6 7 days after the effective date of this act The members of the Travel and Tourism Division Advisory Committee, as such committee existed 8 9 immediately prior to July 1, 2012, shall be the initial members of the 10 commission and may be reappointed as provided in this section. The terms of initial members of the commission representing entities designated by 11 subdivisions (2)(b), (d), (f), and (h) of this section shall be two 12 13 years, beginning on July 1, 2012. (3)(a) The Governor shall, within thirty days after the effective 6 7 date of this act, appoint the members of the commission to begin serving at such time, prior to approval by the Legislature. The members shall 8 consist of eleven residents of the State of Nebraska. Four of the members 9 shall have professional, volunteer, or public service experience that 10 contributes to the fiduciary and governance duties of the commission. 11 12 Seven of the members shall be affiliated with the tourism industry. One member shall be appointed from each of the eleven districts designated in 13 subdivision (b) of this subsection. 14

(b) For purposes of this section, the state is hereby divided into
 eleven districts. The limits and designations of the eleven districts

administrative, lawfully commenced prior to July 1, 2012, or which could have been commenced prior to that date, by or against the division or any employee thereof in his or her official capacity or in relation to the discharge of his or her official duties, shall abate by reason of the transfer of duties and functions from the division to the commission.

 4 marketing services, and state aid to local governments and the tourism
 5 industry in Nebraska legislation or funding requirements.

6 (3) All advertising contracts awarded by the commission concerning 7 travel and tourism shall be based on competitive bids. Contracts shall be 8 awarded to the lowest responsible bidder, taking into consideration the 9 best interests of the state, the quality of performance of the services 10 rendered, the conformity with specifications, the purposes for which 11 required, and the time of completion. In determining the lowest responsible bidder, in addition to price, the commission shall consider: 12 13 (a) The ability, capacity, creativity, and skill of the bidder to perform 14 the contract required; (b) the character, integrity, reputation, 15 judgment, experience, and efficiency of the bidder; (c) whether the 16 bidder can perform the contract within the time specified; (d) the 17 quality of performance of previous contracts; (e) the previous and 18 existing compliance by the bidder with laws relating to the contract; and 19 (f) such other information as may be secured having a bearing on the decision to award the contract. The commission shall advertise for bids 20 21 for the awarding of contracts concerning travel and tourism pursuant to 22 sections 73-101 to 73-105. At least thirty working days shall elapse 23 between the time formal bids are advertised for and the time of their 24 opening. Contracts shall be awarded within sixty working days after the 25 bidding has been closed. Each person submitting a bid shall be notified by certified mail as to whom the contract was awarded. 26

(2) A community or organization applying for a marketing assistance 8 9 grant shall provide a plan to the commission that includes: (a) Documentation that the event will attract out-of-state visitors; (b) 10 details regarding the type of marketing that would be carried out with 11 state funds; (c) methodologies used to track the impact of marketing 12 13 efforts and the number of out-of-state visitors attending the event; and (d) details regarding the potential national or international press 14 coverage that will be generated by the event. 15

(3) The commission shall develop a program to provide innovative 16 17 tourism grants to communities or organizations that provide tourism and visitor promotion services, host events, or promote attractions which 18 result in either (a) an increased number of nonlocal, instate visitors or 19 (b) an increased number of both nonlocal, instate visitors and out-of-20 state visitors. Innovative tourism grants may include, but not be limited 21 to, marketing assistance, planning assistance, basic support, and 22 23 regional cooperation. Innovative tourism grants shall not be used for 24 equipment or capital facility development or improvements.

26 committee of no fewer than three individuals representing the public
27 sector, the private sector, and citizens at large. The technical review
28 committee and the executive director shall review and score applications
