- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; to amend section 60-6,287,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 60-601, 60-605,
- and 60-6,179.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016; to
- 4 provide for the operation of autonomous motor vehicles as
- 5 prescribed; to define terms; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal
- 6 the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-601, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 3 60-601 Sections 60-601 to 60-6,383 <u>and sections 3, 4, 5, and 6 of</u>
- 4 this act shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Rules of the
- 5 Road.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 60-605, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 7 2016, is amended to read:
- 8 60-605 For purposes of the Nebraska Rules of the Road, the
- 9 definitions found in sections 60-606 to 60-676 and sections 3 and 4 of
- 10 this act shall be used.
- 11 Sec. 3. <u>Autonomous motor vehicle means any motor vehicle equipped</u>
- 12 <u>with autonomous technology.</u>
- 13 Sec. 4. <u>Autonomous technology means technology installed on a motor</u>
- 14 <u>vehicle that has the capability to drive the motor vehicle on which the</u>
- 15 technology is installed without active control or monitoring by a human
- 16 operator. The term excludes a motor vehicle equipped with active safety
- 17 systems or driver assistance systems, including, without limitation, a
- 18 system to provide electronic blind spot assistance, crash avoidance,
- 19 emergency braking, parking assistance, adaptive cruise control, lane keep
- 20 <u>assistance</u>, <u>lane departure warning</u>, or a traffic jam and queuing
- 21 assistant, unless any such system alone or in combination with other
- 22 systems enables the motor vehicle on which the technology is installed to
- 23 drive without active control or monitoring by a human operator.
- Sec. 5. (1) A person who possesses a valid operator's license may
- operate an autonomous motor vehicle in autonomous mode on the highways of
- 26 <u>this state.</u>
- 27 (2) For purposes of the Nebraska Rules of the Road and all other
- 28 laws that apply to the operation of a motor vehicle in this state, a
- 29 person shall be deemed to be the operator of an autonomous motor vehicle
- 30 operating in autonomous mode when the person causes the motor vehicle's
- 31 <u>autonomous technology to engage, regardless of whether the person is</u>

- 1 physically present in the motor vehicle while the motor vehicle is
- 2 <u>operating in autonomous mode.</u>
- 3 Sec. 6. An autonomous motor vehicle operating on the highways of
- 4 this state shall meet applicable federal standards and regulations and
- 5 state laws and rules and regulations for such motor vehicle. The
- 6 <u>autonomous motor vehicle shall:</u>
- 7 <u>(1) Have a system to safely alert the operator if an autonomous</u>
- 8 technology failure is detected while the autonomous technology is
- 9 <u>engaged. When an alert is given, the system must:</u>
- 10 (a) Require the operator to take control of the autonomous motor
- 11 vehicle; and
- 12 <u>(b) Be capable of bringing the autonomous motor vehicle to a</u>
- 13 <u>complete stop if the operator does not, or is not able to, take control</u>
- 14 of the autonomous motor vehicle;
- 15 (2) Have a means, inside the autonomous motor vehicle, to visually
- 16 <u>indicate when the autonomous motor vehicle is operating in autonomous</u>
- 17 mode; and
- 18 (3) Be capable of being operated in compliance with all traffic and
- 19 <u>motor vehicle laws of this state.</u>
- 20 Sec. 7. Section 60-6,179.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 21 2016, is amended to read:
- 22 60-6,179.01 (1) This section does not apply to an operator of a
- 23 commercial motor vehicle if section 60-6,179.02 applies.
- 24 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3) of this section,
- 25 no person shall use a handheld wireless communication device to read a
- 26 written communication, manually type a written communication, or send a
- 27 written communication while operating a motor vehicle which is in motion.
- 28 (3) The prohibition in subsection (2) of this section does not apply
- 29 to:
- 30 (a) A person performing his or her official duties as a law
- 31 enforcement officer, a firefighter, an ambulance driver, or an emergency

- 1 medical technician; or
- 2 <u>(b) A person operating an autonomous motor vehicle while the</u>
- 3 <u>autonomous motor vehicle is operating in autonomous mode; or</u>
- 4 $\underline{\text{(c)}}$ A person operating a motor vehicle in an emergency
- 5 situation.
- 6 (4) Enforcement of this section by state or local law enforcement
- 7 agencies shall be accomplished only as a secondary action when a driver
- 8 of a motor vehicle has been cited or charged with a traffic violation or
- 9 some other offense.
- 10 (5) Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of a
- 11 traffic infraction. Any person who is found guilty of a traffic
- 12 infraction under this section shall be assessed points on his or her
- 13 motor vehicle operator's license pursuant to section 60-4,182 and shall
- 14 be fined:
- 15 (a) Two hundred dollars for the first offense;
- (b) Three hundred dollars for a second offense; and
- 17 (c) Five hundred dollars for a third and subsequent offense.
- 18 (6) For purposes of this section:
- 19 (a) Commercial motor vehicle has the same meaning as in section
- 20 75-362;
- 21 (b)(i) Handheld wireless communication device means any device that
- 22 provides for written communication between two or more parties and is
- 23 capable of receiving, displaying, or transmitting written communication.
- 24 (ii) Handheld wireless communication device includes, but is not
- 25 limited to, a mobile or cellular telephone, a text messaging device, a
- 26 personal digital assistant, a pager, or a laptop computer.
- 27 (iii) Handheld wireless communication device does not include an
- 28 electronic device that is part of the motor vehicle or permanently
- 29 attached to the motor vehicle or a handsfree wireless communication
- 30 device; and
- 31 (c) Written communication includes, but is not limited to, a text

- 1 message, an instant message, electronic mail, and Internet web sites.
- 2 Sec. 8. Section 60-6,287, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 60-6,287 It <u>is</u> shall be unlawful to operate upon any public highway
- 5 in this state a motor vehicle which is equipped with or in which is
- 6 located a television set so placed that the viewing screen is visible to
- 7 the driver while operating such <u>motor</u>vehicle, <u>including an autonomous</u>
- 8 <u>motor vehicle operating in autonomous mode</u>. Any person violating this
- 9 section <u>is</u> shall be guilty of a Class V misdemeanor.

- 11 Nebraska, and sections 60-601, 60-605, and 60-6,179.01, Revised Statutes
