- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to prescription drug monitoring; to amend
- 2 section 71-2454, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016; to
- 3 change requirements for veterinarians; to harmonize provisions; and
- 4 to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 71-2454, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2016, is amended to read:
- 3 71-2454 (1) An entity described in section 71-2455 shall establish a
- 4 system of prescription drug monitoring for the purposes of (a) preventing
- 5 the misuse of controlled substances that are prescribed and (b) allowing
- 6 prescribers and dispensers to monitor the care and treatment of patients
- 7 for whom such a prescription drug is prescribed to ensure that such
- 8 prescription drugs are used for medically appropriate purposes and that
- 9 the State of Nebraska remains on the cutting edge of medical information
- 10 technology.
- 11 (2) Such system of prescription drug monitoring shall be implemented
- 12 as follows: Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section,
- 13 beginning January 1, 2017, all dispensed prescriptions of controlled
- 14 substances shall be reported; and except as provided in subsection (4) of
- 15 <u>this section</u>, beginning January 1, 2018, all prescription information
- 16 shall be reported to the prescription drug monitoring system. The
- 17 prescription drug monitoring system shall include, but not be limited to,
- 18 provisions that:
- 19 (a) Prohibit any patient from opting out of the prescription drug
- 20 monitoring system;
- 21 (b) Require all prescriptions dispensed in this state or to an
- 22 address in this state to be entered into the system by the dispenser or
- 23 his or her designee daily after such prescription is dispensed, including
- 24 those for patients paying cash for such prescription drug or otherwise
- 25 not relying on a third-party payor for payment for the prescription drug;
- 26 (c) Allow all prescribers or dispensers of prescription drugs to
- 27 access the system at no cost to such prescriber or dispenser; and
- 28 (d) Ensure that such system includes information relating to all
- 29 payors, including, but not limited to, the medical assistance program
- 30 established pursuant to the Medical Assistance Act.
- 31 Dispensers may begin on February 25, 2016, to report dispensing of

- 1 prescriptions to the entity described in section 71-2455 which is
- 2 responsible for establishing the system of prescription drug monitoring.
- 3 (3) Prescription information that shall be submitted electronically
- 4 to the prescription drug monitoring system shall be determined by the
- 5 entity described in section 71-2455 and shall include, but not be limited
- 6 to:
- 7 (a) The patient's name, address, and date of birth;
- 8 (b) The name and address of the pharmacy dispensing the 9 prescription;
- 10 (c) The date the prescription is issued;
- 11 (d) The date the prescription is filled;
- 12 (e) The name of the drug dispensed or the National Drug Code number
- 13 as published by the federal Food and Drug Administration of the drug
- 14 dispensed;
- 15 (f) The strength of the drug prescribed;
- 16 (g) The quantity of the drug prescribed and the number of days'
- 17 supply; and
- 18 (h) The prescriber's name and National Provider Identifier number or
- 19 Drug Enforcement Administration number when reporting a controlled
- 20 substance.
- 21 (4) Beginning January 1, <u>2019</u> 2018, a veterinarian licensed under
- 22 the Veterinary Medicine and Surgery Practice Act shall be required to
- 23 report a dispensed prescription of controlled substances listed on
- 24 Schedule II, Schedule III, or Schedule IV pursuant to section 28-405.
- 25 (5) All prescription drug information submitted pursuant to this
- 26 section, all data contained in the prescription drug monitoring system,
- 27 and any report obtained from data contained in the prescription drug
- 28 monitoring system are not public records and may be withheld pursuant to
- 29 section 84-712.05.
- 30 (6) For purposes of this section:
- 31 (a) Designee means any licensed or registered health care

- 1 professional designated by a dispenser to act as an agent of the
- 2 dispenser for purposes of submitting or accessing data in the
- 3 prescription drug monitoring system and who is directly supervised by
- 4 such dispenser;
- 5 (b) Dispenser means a person authorized in the jurisdiction in which
- 6 he or she is practicing to deliver a prescription to the ultimate user by
- 7 or pursuant to the lawful order of a prescriber but does not include (i)
- 8 the delivery of such prescription drug for immediate use for purposes of
- 9 inpatient hospital care or emergency department care, (ii) the
- 10 administration of a prescription drug by an authorized person upon the
- 11 lawful order of a prescriber, (iii) a wholesale distributor of a
- 12 prescription drug monitored by the prescription drug monitoring system,
- or (iv) through December 31, 2018 2017, a veterinarian licensed under the
- 14 Veterinary Medicine and Surgery Practice Act when dispensing
- 15 prescriptions for animals in the usual course of providing professional
- 16 services; and
- 17 (c) Prescriber means a health care professional authorized to
- 18 prescribe in the profession which he or she practices.
