- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Treatment and Corrections Act;
- to amend section 83-184, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 3 2016; to provide additional options for committed persons to work or
- 4 participate in rehabilitative activities outside department
- 5 facilities; and to repeal the original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 83-184, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2016, is amended to read:
- 3 83-184 (1) When the conduct, behavior, mental attitude, and
- 4 conditions indicate that a person committed to the department and the
- 5 general society of the state will be benefited, and there is reason to
- 6 believe that the best interests of the people of the state and the person
- 7 committed to the department will be served thereby, in that order, and
- 8 upon the recommendation of the board in the case of each committed
- 9 offender, the director may authorize such person, under prescribed
- 10 conditions, to:
- 11 (a) Visit a specifically designated place or places and return to
- 12 the same or another facility. An extension of limits may be granted to
- 13 permit a visit to a dying relative, attendance at the funeral of a
- 14 relative, the obtaining of medical services, the contacting of
- 15 prospective employers, or for any other reason consistent with the public
- 16 interest; or
- 17 (b) Work at paid employment or participate in a training program in
- 18 the community on a voluntary basis whenever:
- 19 (i) Such paid employment will not result in the displacement of
- 20 employed workers, or be applied in skills, crafts, or trades in which
- 21 there is a surplus of available gainful labor in the locality, or impair
- 22 existing contracts for services; and
- 23 (ii) The rates of pay and other conditions of employment will not be
- 24 less than those paid or provided for work of similar nature in the
- locality in which the work is to be performed; or  $\pm$
- 26 <u>(c) Participate in substance abuse evaluations or treatment, attend</u>
- 27 <u>rehabilitative programming or treatment, seek residency or employment, or</u>
- 28 participate in structured programming as provided in section 83-182.01.
- 29 (2) The wages earned by a person authorized to work at paid
- 30 employment in the community under the provisions of this section shall be
- 31 credited by the chief executive officer of the facility to such person's

- 1 wage fund. The director shall authorize the chief executive officer to
- 2 withhold up to five percent of such person's net wages. The funds
- 3 withheld pursuant to this subsection shall be remitted to the State
- 4 Treasurer for credit as provided in subsection (2) of section 33-157.
- 5 (3) A person authorized to work at paid employment in the community
- 6 under the provisions of this section may be required to pay, and the
- 7 director is authorized to collect, such costs incident to the person's
- 8 confinement as the director deems appropriate and reasonable. Collections
- 9 shall be deposited in the state treasury as miscellaneous receipts.
- 10 (4) A person authorized to work at paid employment in the community
- 11 under the provisions of this section may be required to pay restitution.
- 12 The director shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations which will
- 13 protect the committed offender's rights to due process and govern the
- 14 collection of restitution as provided in section 83-184.01.
- 15 (5) The willful failure of a person to remain within the extended
- 16 limits of his or her confinement or to return within the time prescribed
- 17 to a facility designated by the director may be deemed an escape from
- 18 custody punishable as provided in section 28-912.
- 19 (6) No person employed in the community under the provisions of this
- 20 section or otherwise released shall, while working in such employment in
- 21 the community or going to or from such employment or during the time of
- 22 such release, be deemed to be an agent, employee, or servant of the
- 23 state.
