## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 797**

- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; to amend sections
   28-503 and 28-504, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
   penalty provisions for second and third degree arson; and to repeal
   the original sections.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 28-503, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

28-503 (1) A person commits arson in the second degree if he or she intentionally damages a building or property contained within a building by starting a fire or causing an explosion or if a fire is started or an explosion is caused in the perpetration of any robbery, burglary, or felony criminal mischief.

8 (2) The following affirmative defenses may be introduced into
9 evidence upon prosecution for a violation of this section:

10 (a) No person other than the accused has a security or proprietary
11 interest in the damaged building, or, if other persons have such
12 interests, all of them consented to his or her conduct; or

(b) The accused's sole intent was to destroy or damage the buildingfor a lawful and proper purpose.

15 (3) Arson in the second degree is a Class <u>IIA</u> <del>III</del> felony.

Sec. 2. Section 28-504, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

18 28-504 (1) A person commits arson in the third degree if he or she 19 intentionally sets fire to, burns, causes to be burned, or by the use of 20 any explosive, damages or destroys, or causes to be damaged or destroyed, 21 any property of another person without such other person's consent. Such 22 property shall not be contained within a building and shall not be a 23 building or occupied structure.

(2) Arson in the third degree is a Class <u>IIIA</u> <del>IV</del> felony if the
 damages amount to one thousand five hundred dollars or more.

(3) Arson in the third degree is a Class <u>IV felony</u> <del>I misdemeanor</del> if
the damages are five hundred dollars or more but less than one thousand
five hundred dollars.

(4) Arson in the third degree is a Class <u>I</u> <del>II</del> misdemeanor if the
 damages are less than five hundred dollars.
