- (d) Are not eligible for medical assistance under any mandatory 12

- (11) Persons eligible pursuant to section 68-992. 16
- 17 Except as provided in <u>subdivision</u> (8) of this <u>section</u> and <u>section</u>
- 68-972, eligibility shall be determined under this section using an 18
- income budgetary methodology that determines children's eligibility at no 19
- greater than two hundred percent of the Office of Management and Budget 20
- 21 income poverty guideline and adult eligibility using adult income
- 22 greater than the applicable categorical eligibility
- standards established pursuant to state or federal law. Except as 23
- 24 otherwise provided in subdivision (8) of this section, the The department
- shall determine eligibility under this section pursuant to such income 25
- 26 budgetary methodology and subdivision (1)(q) of section 68-1713.
