- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to amend sections 61-222, 61-224, and 81-829.33, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and
- 3 sections 9-1,101 and 13-2704, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019; to
- 4 provide for, change, and eliminate fund transfers; to change
- 5 authorized uses of funds; to repeal a fund; to harmonize provisions;
- 6 to repeal the original sections; to outright repeal section 46-752,
- 7 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; and to declare an emergency.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

LB1009 2020

- 1 Section 1. The State Treasurer shall transfer three million eight
- 2 <u>hundred thousand dollars from the General Fund to the Critical</u>
- 3 Infrastructure Facilities Cash Fund on or before September 15, 2020, on
- 4 such date as directed by the budget administrator of the budget division
- 5 of the Department of Administrative Services.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 9-1,101, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is
- 7 amended to read:
- 8 9-1,101 (1) The Nebraska Bingo Act, the Nebraska County and City
- 9 Lottery Act, the Nebraska Lottery and Raffle Act, the Nebraska Pickle
- 10 Card Lottery Act, the Nebraska Small Lottery and Raffle Act, and section
- 11 9-701 shall be administered and enforced by the Charitable Gaming
- 12 Division of the Department of Revenue, which division is hereby created.
- 13 The Department of Revenue shall make annual reports to the Governor,
- 14 Legislature, Auditor of Public Accounts, and Attorney General on all tax
- 15 revenue received, expenses incurred, and other activities relating to the
- 16 administration and enforcement of such acts. The report submitted to the
- 17 Legislature shall be submitted electronically.
- 18 (2) The Charitable Gaming Operations Fund is hereby created. Any
- 19 money in the fund available for investment shall be invested by the state
- 20 investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the
- 21 Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 22 (3)(a) Forty percent of the taxes collected pursuant to sections
- 23 9-239, 9-344, 9-429, and 9-648 shall be available to the Charitable
- 24 Gaming Division for administering and enforcing the acts listed in
- 25 subsection (1) of this section and providing administrative support for
- 26 the Nebraska Commission on Problem Gambling. The remaining sixty percent
- 27 shall be transferred to the General Fund. Any portion of the forty
- 28 percent not used by the division in the administration and enforcement of
- 29 such acts and section shall be distributed as provided in this
- 30 subsection.
- 31 (b) Beginning July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2021, on or before the

- 1 last day of the last month of each calendar quarter, the State Treasurer
- 2 shall transfer one hundred thousand dollars from the Charitable Gaming
- 3 Operations Fund to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund.—Beginning
- 4 July 1, 2021, on or before November 1 each year, the State Treasurer
- 5 shall transfer one hundred thousand dollars from the Charitable Gaming
- 6 Operations Fund to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund, except that
- 7 no transfer shall occur if the Charitable Gaming Operations Fund contains
- 8 less than one hundred thousand dollars.
- 9 (c) Any money remaining in the Charitable Gaming Operations Fund
- 10 after the transfer pursuant to subdivision (b) of this subsection not
- 11 used by the Charitable Gaming Division in its administration and
- 12 enforcement duties pursuant to this section may be transferred to the
- 13 General Fund <u>and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund</u> at the direction
- 14 of the Legislature.
- 15 (4) The Tax Commissioner shall employ investigators who shall be
- 16 vested with the authority and power of a law enforcement officer to carry
- 17 out the laws of this state administered by the Tax Commissioner or the
- 18 Department of Revenue and to enforce sections 28-1101 to 28-1117 relating
- 19 to possession of a gambling device. For purposes of enforcing sections
- 20 28-1101 to 28-1117, the authority of the investigators shall be limited
- 21 to investigating possession of a gambling device, notifying local law
- 22 enforcement authorities, and reporting suspected violations to the county
- 23 attorney for prosecution.
- 24 (5) The Charitable Gaming Division may charge a fee for publications
- 25 and listings it produces. The fee shall not exceed the cost of
- 26 publication and distribution of such items. The division may also charge
- 27 a fee for making a copy of any record in its possession equal to the
- 28 actual cost per page. The division shall remit the fees to the State
- 29 Treasurer for credit to the Charitable Gaming Operations Fund.
- 30 (6) For administrative purposes only, the Nebraska Commission on
- 31 Problem Gambling shall be located within the Charitable Gaming Division.

- 1 The division shall provide office space, furniture, equipment, and
- 2 stationery and other necessary supplies for the commission. Commission
- 3 staff shall be appointed, supervised, and terminated by the director of
- 4 the Gamblers Assistance Program pursuant to section 9-1004.
- 5 Sec. 3. Section 13-2704, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is
- 6 amended to read:
- 7 13-2704 (1) The Civic and Community Center Financing Fund is
- 8 created. The fund shall be administered by the department. Any money in
- 9 the fund available for investment shall be invested by the state
- 10 investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the
- 11 Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. Transfers may be made from the fund
- 12 to the General Fund, the Department of Revenue Enforcement Fund, and the
- 13 State Colleges Sport Facilities Cash Fund at the direction of the
- 14 Legislature.
- 15 (2)(a) The department shall use the Civic and Community Center
- 16 Financing Fund for the following purposes:
- 17 (i) For grants of assistance as described in section 13-2704.01;
- 18 (ii) For grants of assistance as described in section 13-2704.02;
- 19 and
- 20 (iii) For reasonable and necessary costs of the department directly
- 21 related to the administration of the fund, not to exceed the amount
- 22 needed to employ a one-half full-time equivalent employee.
- 23 (b) Grants of assistance shall not be used for programming,
- 24 marketing, advertising, or facility-staffing activities.
- 25 (3) The State Treasurer shall transfer two hundred fifty thousand
- 26 dollars from the Civic and Community Center Financing Fund to the State
- 27 Colleges Sport Facilities Cash Fund on October 1 of 2012, 2013, and 2014.
- 28 Commencing October 1, 2015, and every year thereafter, the State
- 29 Treasurer shall transfer three hundred thousand dollars from the Civic
- 30 and Community Center Financing Fund to the State Colleges Sport
- 31 Facilities Cash Fund.

- 1 Sec. 4. Section 61-222, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 61-222 The Water Sustainability Fund is created in the Department of
- 4 Natural Resources. The fund shall be used in accordance with the
- 5 provisions established in Laws 2014, LB1098, and for costs directly
- 6 related to the administration of the fund, except that transfers may be
- 7 made from the fund as provided in this section.
- 8 The fund shall consist of money transferred to the fund by the
- 9 Legislature, other funds as appropriated by the Legislature, and money
- 10 donated as gifts, bequests, or other contributions from public or private
- 11 entities. Funds made available by any department or agency of the United
- 12 States may also be credited to the fund if so directed by such department
- 13 or agency. Any money in the fund available for investment shall be
- 14 invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital
- 15 Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. Investment
- 16 earnings from investment of money in the fund shall be credited to the
- 17 fund.
- 18 It is the intent of the Legislature that twenty-one million dollars
- 19 be transferred from the General Fund to the Water Sustainability Fund in
- 20 fiscal year 2014-15 and that eleven million dollars be transferred from
- 21 the General Fund to the Water Sustainability Fund each fiscal year
- 22 beginning in fiscal year 2015-16. It is the intent of the Legislature
- 23 that three million dollars be transferred annually from the Water
- 24 Sustainability Fund to the Nebraska Resources Development Fund in
- 25 FY2015-16 and in FY2016-17.
- 26 <u>The State Treasurer shall transfer one hundred seventy-five thousand</u>
- 27 <u>dollars from the Water Sustainability Fund to the Department of Natural</u>
- 28 Resources Cash Fund on or before June 30, 2021, on such dates and in such
- 29 <u>amounts as directed by the budget administrator of the budget division of</u>
- 30 <u>the Department of Administrative Services.</u>
- 31 The State Treasurer shall transfer four hundred twenty-five thousand

- 1 dollars from the Water Sustainability Fund to the Department of Natural
- 2 Resources Cash Fund on or before June 30, 2021, on such dates and in such
- 3 <u>amounts as directed by the budget administrator of the budget division of</u>
- 4 the Department of Administrative Services.
- 5 The State Treasurer shall transfer five hundred thousand dollars
- 6 from the Water Sustainability Fund to the General Fund on or before June
- 7 30, 2021, on such dates and in such amounts as directed by the budget
- 8 <u>administrator of the budget division of the Department of Administrative</u>
- 9 Services.
- 10 Sec. 5. Section 61-224, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 11 amended to read:
- 12 61-224 There is hereby created the Critical Infrastructure
- 13 Facilities Cash Fund in the Department of Natural Resources. The fund
- 14 shall consist of funds appropriated or transferred by the Legislature.
- 15 The fund shall be used by the Department of Natural Resources (1) to
- 16 provide a grant to a natural resources district to offset costs related
- 17 to soil and water improvements intended to protect critical
- 18 infrastructure facilities within the district which includes military
- 19 installations, transportation routes, and wastewater treatment facilities
- 20 and (2) to provide a grant to an irrigation district for reimbursement of
- 21 costs related to temporary repairs to the main canal and tunnels of an
- 22 interstate irrigation system which experienced a failure. Any funds
- 23 remaining after all such project costs have been completely funded shall
- 24 <u>be transferred to the General Fund</u>. Transfers may be made from the
- 25 Critical Infrastructure Facilities Cash Fund fund to the General Fund at
- 26 the direction of the Legislature. The State Treasurer shall transfer
- 27 three hundred eighty-four thousand two hundred twenty-two dollars plus
- 28 any accrued interest through April 5, 2018, from the Critical
- 29 Infrastructure Facilities Cash Fund to the General Fund on or before June
- 30 30, 2019, on such dates and in such amounts as directed by the budget
- 31 administrator of the budget division of the Department of Administrative

- 1 Services. Any money in the Critical Infrastructure Facilities Cash Fund
- 2 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment
- 3 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
- 4 State Funds Investment Act, and any interest earned by the fund shall be
- 5 credited to the General Fund.
- 6 Sec. 6. Section 81-829.33, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 7 amended to read:
- 8 81-829.33 The Governor's Emergency Cash Fund is created. The fund
- 9 shall consist of federal reimbursements received by the state for
- 10 eligible state administrative costs incurred by the Nebraska Emergency
- 11 Management Agency for administering federal emergency disaster
- 12 declarations and revenue from all other nonfederal government sources.
- 13 Except as provided in section 90-270, the fund shall be used to pay
- 14 eligible costs related to state emergency disaster declarations. The fund
- 15 shall be administered by the State Administrator of the Nebraska
- 16 Emergency Management Agency. Any money in the fund available for
- 17 investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to
- 18 the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds
- 19 Investment Act.
- 20 <u>Transfers may be made from the Governor's Emergency Cash Fund to the</u>
- 21 Cash Reserve Fund at the direction of the Legislature through June 30,
- 22 2021. The State Treasurer shall transfer sixty million dollars from the
- 23 Governor's Emergency Cash Fund to the Cash Reserve Fund between the
- 24 <u>effective date of this act and June 30, 2021, on such dates and in such</u>
- 25 amounts as directed by the budget administrator of the budget division of
- 26 the Department of Administrative Services.
- 27 Sec. 7. Original sections 61-222, 61-224, and 81-829.33, Reissue
- 28 Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 9-1,101 and 13-2704, Revised
- 29 Statutes Supplement, 2019, are repealed.
- 30 Sec. 8. The following section is outright repealed: Section 46-752,
- 31 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.
