A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend section 79-729, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to add a high school graduation

3 requirement and provide an exception as prescribed; to provide a

4 duty for schools to submit data to the State Department of

5 Education; to provide duties for the Commissioner of Education and

6 require an annual report to the Legislature; to provide for rules

and regulations as prescribed; and to repeal the original section.

8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 79-729, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 79-729 (1) The Legislature recognizes the importance of assuring
- 4 that all persons who graduate from Nebraska high schools possess certain
- 5 minimum levels of knowledge, skills, and understanding.
- 6 (2) Beginning in school year 1987-88, each high school student shall
- 7 complete a minimum of two hundred high school credit hours prior to
- 8 graduation. At least eighty percent of such credit hours shall be core
- 9 curriculum courses prescribed by the State Board of Education.
- 10 (3)(a) Beginning with the 2021-22 school year, each public high
- 11 school student shall complete and submit to the United States Department
- 12 <u>of Education a Free Application for Federal Student Aid prior to</u>
- 13 graduating from such high school except as otherwise provided in this
- 14 subsection.
- 15 (b) A public high school student shall not be required to comply
- 16 with subdivision (3)(a) of this section if:
- 17 <u>(i) A parent or legal guardian of or a person standing in loco</u>
- 18 parentis to <u>such student signs and submits the appropriate form</u>
- 19 prescribed by the Commissioner of Education pursuant to subdivision (3)
- 20 (c) of this section indicating that such parent, legal guardian, or
- 21 person standing in loco parentis authorizes such student to decline to
- 22 complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid;
- 23 <u>(ii) The school principal or the school principal's designee signs</u>
- 24 and submits the appropriate form prescribed by the Commissioner of
- 25 Education pursuant to subdivision (3)(c) of this section authorizing such
- 26 <u>student to decline to complete and submit a Free Application for Federal</u>
- 27 Student Aid for good cause as determined by the school principal or the
- 28 school principal's designee; or
- 29 <u>(iii) A student who is nineteen years of age or older or is an</u>
- 30 emancipated minor signs and submits the appropriate form prescribed by
- 31 the Commissioner of Education pursuant to subdivision (3)(c) of this

- 1 section stating that such student declines to complete and submit a Free
- 2 <u>Application for Federal Student Aid.</u>
- 3 (c) The Commissioner of Education shall prescribe the forms to be
- 4 used by each public high school for purposes of subdivision (3)(b) of
- 5 this section. Such forms shall be made available:
- 6 (i) By each public high school to students, parents and legal
- 7 guardians of students, and persons standing in loco parentis to students;
- 8 and
- 9 (ii) In English, Spanish, and any other language spoken by a
- 10 <u>majority of the students enrolled in any English learner program at such</u>
- 11 <u>public high school.</u>
- 12 <u>(d) The school principal or the school principal's designee of each</u>
- 13 public high school shall provide such compliance information to the
- 14 school district or governing authority for such public high school and to
- 15 the State Department of Education without disclosing, for any student who
- 16 has complied with the requirements of this subsection, personally
- 17 <u>identifiable information distinguishing whether such compliance was</u>
- 18 pursuant to subdivision (3)(a) of this section or subdivision (3)(b) of
- 19 this section. Such school principal or school principal's designee shall
- 20 provide separately the aggregate number of students who have not complied
- 21 with this subsection, who complied pursuant to subdivision (3)(a) of this
- 22 section, and who complied pursuant to subdivision (3)(b) of this section,
- 23 unless otherwise prohibited by federal or state law regarding the
- 24 <u>confidentiality of student educational information.</u>
- 25 (e) On or before December 31, 2022, and on or before December 31 of
- 26 each year thereafter, the Commissioner of Education shall electronically
- 27 <u>submit a report with the information received by the State Department of</u>
- 28 Education pursuant to subdivision (3)(d) of this section to the Clerk of
- 29 <u>the Legislature.</u>
- 30 (4) The State Board of Education may establish recommended statewide
- 31 graduation guidelines. This section does not prohibit the governing board

- 1 of any high school from prescribing specific graduation guidelines as
- 2 <u>long as such guidelines do not conflict with this section.</u>
- 3 (5) This section does not apply to high school students whose
- 4 individualized education plans prescribe a different course of
- 5 instruction. This section does not prohibit the governing board of any
- 6 high school from prescribing specific graduation guidelines as long as
- 7 such guidelines do not conflict with this section.
- 8 (6) For purposes of this section, high school means grades nine
- 9 through twelve and credit hour shall be defined by appropriate rules and
- 10 regulations of the State Board of Education but shall not be less than
- 11 the amount of credit given for successful completion of a course which
- 12 meets at least one period per week for at least one semester.
- 13 (7) The State Department of Education shall adopt and promulgate
- 14 rules and regulations as necessary to implement this section. Such rules
- 15 and regulations shall include, but not be limited to:
- 16 (a) A timeline for the distribution of the Free Application for
- 17 Federal Student Aid and the forms prescribed pursuant to subdivision (3)
- 18 (c) of this section by public high schools and for the submission of the
- 19 Free Application for Federal Student Aid and the forms prescribed
- 20 pursuant to subdivision (3)(c) of this section by students;
- 21 (b) Standards regarding the information that a public high school
- 22 must provide to students regarding:
- 23 (i) Instructions for filling out the Free Application for Federal
- 24 <u>Student Aid;</u>
- 25 (ii) The options available to a student under subdivision (3)(b) of
- 26 this section if a student wishes to decline to complete and submit a Free
- 27 <u>Application for Federal Student Aid; and</u>
- 28 (iii) The method by which a student shall provide proof to the
- 29 public high school that such student has completed and submitted the Free
- 30 Application for Federal Student Aid or a form prescribed pursuant to
- 31 subdivision (3)(c) of this section; and

- 1 (c) A requirement for each public high school to report the number
- 2 <u>of students who completed and submitted a Free Application for Federal</u>
- 3 Student Aid and the number of students who instead submitted a form
- 4 prescribed pursuant to subdivision (3)(c) of this section.
