- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to social services; to amend sections 71-801 2 and 71-831, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 3 68-901, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019; to change provisions 4 regarding contracts and agreements relating to the medical assistance program; to create a fund; to provide duties regarding 5 job-skills programs for applicants for medical assistance; to 6 7 transfer provisions; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original 8 sections; and to declare an emergency.
- 9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 68-901, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 68-901 Sections 68-901 to 68-994 <u>and sections 2 to 4 of this act</u>
- 4 shall be known and may be cited as the Medical Assistance Act.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 71-831, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 6 amended to read:
- 7 71-831 All contracts and agreements relating to the medical
- 8 assistance program governing at-risk managed care service delivery for
- 9 behavioral health services entered into by the department and existing on
- 10 or after the effective date of this act July 21, 2016, shall:
- 11 (1) Provide a definition and cap on administrative spending such
- 12 that (a) administrative expenditures do not include profit greater than
- 13 the contracted amount, (b) any administrative spending is necessary to
- 14 improve the health status of the population to be served, and (c)
- 15 administrative expenditures do not include contractor incentives.
- 16 Administrative spending shall not under any circumstances exceed twelve
- 17 percent. Such spending shall be tracked by the contractor and reported to
- 18 the department quarterly to the department and electronically to the
- 19 <u>Clerk of the Legislature</u>;
- 20 (2) Provide a definition of annual contractor profits and losses and
- 21 restrict such profits and losses under the contract so that profit shall
- 22 not exceed a percentage specified by the department but not more than
- 23 three percent per year as a percentage of the aggregate of all income and
- 24 revenue earned by the contractor and related parties, including parent
- 25 and subsidiary companies and risk-bearing partners, under the contract;
- 26 (3) Provide for <u>return reinvestment</u> of (a) any remittance if the
- 27 contractor does not meet the minimum medical loss ratio, (b) performance
- 28 contingencies imposed by the department, and (c) any unearned incentive
- 29 funds, and (c) any other funds in excess of the contractor limitations
- 30 identified in state or federal statute or contract to the State Treasurer
- 31 for credit to the Medicaid Managed Care Excess Profit Fund to fund

- 1 additional health services for children, families, and adults according
- 2 to a plan developed with input from stakeholders and approved by the
- 3 department. Such plan shall address the health needs of adults and
- 4 children, including filling service gaps and providing system
- 5 improvements;
- 6 (4) Provide for a minimum medical loss ratio of eighty-five percent
- 7 of the aggregate of all income and revenue earned by the contractor and
- 8 related parties under the contract;
- 9 (5) Provide that contractor incentives, in addition to potential
- 10 profit, be up to two percent of the aggregate of all income and revenue
- 11 earned by the contractor and related parties under the contract; and
- 12 (6) Be reviewed and awarded competitively and in full compliance
- 13 with the procurement requirements of the State of Nebraska.
- 14 Sec. 3. The Medicaid Managed Care Excess Profit Fund is created.
- 15 The fund shall contain money returned to the State Treasurer pursuant to
- 16 subdivision (3) of section 2 of this act. The fund shall first be used to
- 17 offset any losses under subdivision (2) of section 2 of this act and then
- 18 to provide for services addressing the health needs of adults and
- 19 children under the Medical Assistance Act, including filling service
- 20 gaps, providing system improvements, and sustaining access to care as
- 21 determined by the Legislature. The fund shall only be used for the
- 22 purposes described in this section. Any money in the fund available for
- 23 investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to
- 24 the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds
- 25 Investment Act.
- 26 Sec. 4. (1) <u>Beginning October 1, 2020, the Department of Health and</u>
- 27 Human Services shall inform each adult applicant for medical assistance
- 28 about job-skills programs within the Department of Health and Human
- 29 <u>Services</u>, the <u>Department of Labor</u>, or other skill-based programs that
- 30 could assist the applicant for medical assistance in obtaining job skills
- 31 or training, employment, higher-paying jobs, or related skills. The

- 1 Department of Health and Human Services shall connect interested
- 2 applicants to such job-skills programs. The job-skills programs may be
- 3 <u>utilized on a voluntary basis by applicants for medical assistance or</u>
- 4 recipients of medical assistance. The job-skills programs do not affect
- 5 the receipt of services provided under the Medical Assistance Act.
- 6 (2) Beginning February 1, 2021, and within thirty days of the
- 7 expiration of each subsequent calendar quarter within the years 2021 and
- 8 <u>2022, the Department of Health and Human Services shall report</u>
- 9 electronically to the Clerk of the Legislature on the total number of
- 10 applicants for medical assistance who were referred to job-skills
- 11 programs under this section and any job-skills services received as a
- 12 result of this section by applicants for medical assistance.
- 13 (3) Beginning January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2022, the
- 14 Department of Labor shall report quarterly to the Department of Health
- 15 and Human Services the number of applicants for medical assistance who
- 16 <u>were referred to job-skills programs under this section, the number of</u>
- 17 applicants for medical assistance who received help obtaining job skills
- 18 or training, employment, higher-paying jobs, or related skills under this
- 19 section, and the types of job-skills services received as a result of
- 20 this section.
- 21 (4) The Department of Health and Human Services and the Department
- 22 of Labor shall administer this section.
- 23 Sec. 5. Section 71-801, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 24 amended to read:
- 25 71-801 Sections 71-801 to 71-830 71-831 shall be known and may be
- 26 cited as the Nebraska Behavioral Health Services Act.
- 27 Sec. 6. Original sections 71-801 and 71-831, Reissue Revised
- 28 Statutes of Nebraska, and section 68-901, Revised Statutes Supplement,
- 29 2019, are repealed.
- 30 Sec. 7. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 31 passed and approved according to law.
