- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Quality Child Care Act; to amend section 43-2606, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2018; to require the use of the Nebraska Early Childhood Professional Record System for documentation and verification of staff training; and to repeal the original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 43-2606, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2018, is amended to read:
- 3 43-2606 (1) The Department of Health and Human Services shall adopt
- 4 and promulgate rules and regulations for mandatory training requirements
- 5 for providers of child care and school-age-care programs. Such
- 6 requirements shall include preservice orientation and at least four hours
- 7 of annual inservice training. All child care programs required to be
- 8 licensed under section 71-1911 shall show completion of a preservice
- 9 orientation approved or delivered by the department prior to receiving a
- 10 provisional license.
- 11 (2) <u>Beginning January 1, 2020, for programs that report to the</u>
- 12 <u>Nebraska Early Childhood Professional Record System created under section</u>
- 13 <u>71-1962, the department shall use the Nebraska Early Childhood</u>
- 14 Professional Record System to (a) document the training levels of staff
- 15 <u>in specific child care settings to assist parents in selecting optimal</u>
- 16 care settings and (b) verify minimum training requirements of employees
- 17 of such programs The department shall initiate a system of documenting
- 18 the training levels of staff in specific child care settings to assist
- 19 parents in selecting optimal care settings.
- 20 (3) The training requirements shall be designed to meet the health,
- 21 safety, and developmental needs of children and shall be tailored to the
- 22 needs of licensed providers of child care programs. Preservice
- 23 orientation and the training requirements for providers of child care
- 24 programs shall include, but not be limited to, information on sudden
- 25 unexpected infant death syndrome, shaken baby syndrome, and child abuse.
- 26 (4) The department shall provide or arrange for training
- 27 opportunities throughout the state and shall provide information
- 28 regarding training opportunities to all providers of child care programs
- 29 at the time of registration or licensure, when renewing a registration,
- 30 or on a yearly basis following licensure.
- 31 (5) Each provider of child care and school-age-care programs

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1 receiving orientation or training shall provide his or her social

- 2 security number to the department.
- 3 (6) The department shall review and provide recommendations to the
- 4 Governor for updating rules and regulations adopted and promulgated under
- 5 this section at least every five years.
