A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to paternity; to amend section 43-1411, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to provide for intervention by a biological parent in certain proceedings involving juveniles as prescribed; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original section.

Section 1. Section 43-1411, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

(1) A civil proceeding to establish the paternity of a 3 43-1411 child may be instituted, in the court of the district where the child is 4 5 domiciled or found or, for cases under the Uniform Interstate Family Support Act, where the alleged father is domiciled, by (a) (1) the mother 6 or the alleged father of such child, either during pregnancy or within 7 four years after the child's birth, unless (i) (a) a valid consent or 8 9 relinquishment has been made pursuant to sections 43-104.08 to 43-104.25 or section 43-105 for purposes of adoption or (ii) (b) a county court or 10 separate juvenile court has jurisdiction over the custody of the child or 11 jurisdiction over an adoption matter with respect to such child pursuant 12 13 to sections 43-101 to 43-116 or (b) (2) the guardian or next friend of such child or the state, either during pregnancy or within eighteen years 14 after the child's birth. Summons shall issue and be served as in other 15 civil proceedings, except that such summons may be directed to the 16 17 sheriff of any county in the state and may be served in any county.

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a person claiming to 18 19 be the biological father of a child over which the juvenile court already has jurisdiction may file a complaint to intervene in such juvenile 20 proceeding to institute an action to establish the paternity of the 21 child. The complaint to intervene shall be accompanied by an affidavit 22 23 under oath that the affiant believes he is the biological father of the 24 juvenile. No filing fee shall be charged for filing the complaint and 25 affidavit. Upon filing of the complaint and affidavit, the juvenile court shall enter an order pursuant to section 43-1414 to require genetic 26 testing and to require the juvenile to be made available for genetic 27 28 testing. The costs of genetic testing shall be paid by the intervenor, the county, or the state at the discretion of the juvenile court. This 29 subsection does not authorize intervention by a person whose parental 30 31 rights to such child have been terminated by the order of any court of
