LEGISLATIVE BILL 1051

Introduced by Wishart, 27; Williams, 36. Read first time January 16, 2020 Committee: Health and Human Services

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to nursing facilities; to create a fund; to
- 2 provide for grants; and to provide powers and duties.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. <u>(1) The Intergenerational Care Facility Incentive Cash</u>
2	Fund is created. The fund shall consist of transfers from the General
3	Fund and any private donations made directly to the Intergenerational
4	Care Facility Incentive Cash Fund. It is the intent of the Legislature to
5	transfer three hundred thousand dollars from the General Fund for fiscal
6	year 2020-21 to the Intergenerational Care Facility Incentive Cash Fund.
7	The fund shall be used to provide grants pursuant to this section. Any
8	money in the fund available for investment shall be invested by the state
9	investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the
10	<u>Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.</u>
11	<u>(2) The Department of Health and Human Services shall develop</u>

requirements for eligibility, application, and audits for grants from the 12 13 fund consistent with this section in collaboration with statewide associations representing nursing facilities and other stakeholders. The 14 15 department shall meet with such associations prior to October 1, 2020, to 16 identify any statutes, rules, regulations, or other regulatory barriers 17 that impede the development of an intergenerational care facility which provides nursing services and child care and develop recommendations to 18 19 remediate such barriers that do not impact the safety of the staff or recipients of the nursing services and child care or the quality of 20 21 nursing services and child care.

(3) The grants shall be awarded to nursing facilities for one-time startup costs to provide child care in nursing facilities. A nursing facility may be awarded one grant under this section of up to fifty thousand dollars. The grants shall be awarded for modification of structures, modification of outside campus space of the nursing facilities, purchase of child care equipment and supplies, or any combination of such purposes.

(4) The department shall award the grants on the basis of date of
application with rural communities as defined in section 81-1228
receiving priority for applications filed on the same date. A nursing

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1	facility that is under disciplinary action at the time of the application
2	is not eligible for a grant under this section. Each grant recipient
3	shall establish a plan to obtain a step three rating or higher on the
4	quality scale described in section 71-1956 within three years after the
5	<u>date the grant is awarded.</u>
6	(5) A nursing facility that receives a grant under this section
7	shall indicate how the grant was spent on the annual state-audited report
8	submitted to the medical assistance program under the Medical Assistance

9 <u>Act.</u>
