1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to prescription drugs; to amend sections
2	38-2871 and 71-2483, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, sections
3	38-2866.01, 38-2891, and 38-28,106, Revised Statutes Cumulative
4	Supplement, 2018, and section 38-2891.01, Revised Statutes
5	Supplement, 2019; to change provisions regarding supervision of
6	pharmacy technicians and pharmacy interns and transfer of
7	prescriptions between pharmacies; to provide and change powers of
8	pharmacy technicians; to authorize communication of prescriptions
9	for prescribing practitioners; and to repeal the original sections.
10	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 38-2866.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
 Supplement, 2018, is amended to read:

38-2866.01 A pharmacist may supervise any combination of pharmacy 3 technicians and pharmacist interns at any time-up to a total of three 4 people. A pharmacist intern shall be supervised at all times while 5 performing the functions of a pharmacist intern which may include all 6 7 aspects of the practice of pharmacy unless otherwise restricted. This section does not apply to a pharmacist intern who is receiving 8 9 experiential training directed by the accredited pharmacy program in which he or she is enrolled. 10

11 Sec. 2. Section 38-2871, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 12 amended to read:

13 38-2871 (1) Original prescription information for any controlled substances listed in Schedule III, IV, or V of section 28-405 and other 14 prescription drugs or devices not listed in section 28-405 may be 15 transferred between pharmacies for the purpose of refill dispensing on a 16 17 one-time basis, except that pharmacies electronically sharing a realtime, online data base may transfer up to the maximum refills permitted 18 by law and as authorized by the prescribing practitioner on the 19 prescription. Transfers are subject to the following: 20

(a) The transfer is communicated directly between two pharmacists,
or pharmacist interns, or pharmacy technicians, except when the
pharmacies can use a real-time, online data base;

(b) The transferring pharmacist, or pharmacist intern, or pharmacy
 <u>technician</u> indicates void on the record of the prescription;

(c) The transferring pharmacist, Θr pharmacist intern, or pharmacy <u>technician</u> indicates on the record of the prescription the name<u>and</u>, the address, and, if a controlled substance, the Drug Enforcement Administration number of the pharmacy to which the information was transferred, the name of the pharmacist, Θr pharmacist intern, or <u>pharmacy technician</u> receiving the information, the date of transfer, and

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the name of the transferring pharmacist, or pharmacist intern, or 1 2 pharmacy technician, and, if a controlled substance, the Drug Enforcement Administration number of the pharmacy to which the information was 3 4 transferred by the direct communication between two pharmacists; 5 (d) The receiving pharmacist, or pharmacist intern, or pharmacy technician indicates on the record of the transferred prescription that 6 7 the prescription is transferred; 8 (e) The transferred prescription includes the following information: 9 (i) The date of issuance of the original prescription; 10 (ii) The original number of refills authorized; (iii) The date of original dispensing; 11 (iv) The number of valid refills remaining; 12 13 (v) The date and location of last refill; and (vi) The name<u>and</u>, the address, and, if a controlled substance, the 14 Drug Enforcement Administration number of the pharmacy from which the 15 transfer was made, the name of the pharmacist, or pharmacist intern, or 16 17 pharmacy technician transferring the information, the original prescription number, and the date of transfer, and, if a controlled 18 19 substance, the Drug Enforcement Administration number of the pharmacy from which the transfer was made by the direct communication between the 20 21 two pharmacists; and 22 (f) Both the original and transferred prescriptions must be maintained by the transferring and receiving pharmacy for a period of 23 24 five years from the date of transfer.

(2) Nothing in this section shall prevent a pharmacist from
forwarding an original prescription for a noncontrolled substance to
another pharmacy at the request of the patient or the patient's
caregiver. An original prescription for a controlled substance shall not
be forwarded to another pharmacy unless permitted under 21 C.F.R.
1306.25.

31 Sec. 3. Section 38-2891, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

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1 2018, is amended to read:

2 38-2891 (1) A pharmacy technician shall only perform tasks which do 3 not require the professional judgment of a pharmacist and which are 4 subject to verification to assist a pharmacist in the practice of 5 pharmacy.

6 (2) The functions and tasks which shall not be performed by pharmacy7 technicians include, but are not limited to:

8 (a) Receiving oral medical orders from a practitioner or his or her
9 agent except as otherwise provided in subsection (3) of section 38-2870;

10 (b) Providing patient counseling;

(c) Performing any evaluation or necessary clarification of a medical order <u>requiring the clinical judgment of a pharmacist</u> or performing any functions other than strictly clerical functions involving a medical order;

15 (d) Supervising or verifying the tasks and functions of pharmacy 16 technicians;

17 (e) Interpreting or evaluating the data contained in a patient's
18 record maintained pursuant to section 38-2869;

(f) Releasing any confidential information maintained by thepharmacy;

21 (g) Performing any professional consultations; and

(h) Drug product selection, with regard to an individual medical
order, in accordance with the Nebraska Drug Product Selection Act.

24 (3) The director shall, with the recommendation of the board, waive 25 any of the limitations in subsection (2) of this section for purposes of a scientific study of the role of pharmacy technicians approved by the 26 board. Such study shall be based upon providing improved patient care or 27 enhanced pharmaceutical care. Any such waiver shall state the length of 28 the study and shall require that all study data and results be made 29 available to the board upon the completion of the study. Nothing in this 30 subsection requires the board to approve any study proposed under this 31

Sec. 4. Section 38-2891.01, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is
amended to read:

38-2891.01 (1) A pharmacy technician may validate the acts, tasks,
and functions of another pharmacy technician only if:

6 (a) Both pharmacy technicians are certified by a state or national7 certifying body which is approved by the board;

8 (b) Both certified pharmacy technicians are working within the 9 confines of a hospital preparing medications for administration in the 10 hospital or are working within a pharmacy licensed by the department 11 under the supervision of a pharmacist;

(c) Using bar code technology, radio frequency identification
technology, or similar technology to validate the accuracy of medication;

(d) Validating medication that is prepackaged by the manufacturer,
0+ prepackaged and verified by a pharmacist, or verified using technology
pursuant to subdivision (c) of this subsection; and

(e) Acting in accordance with policies and procedures applicable in
the hospital <u>or pharmacy</u> established by the pharmacist in charge.

(2) The pharmacist in charge in a hospital <u>or a pharmacy licensed by</u>
 <u>the department shall establish policies and procedures for validation of</u>
 medication by two or more certified pharmacy technicians before such
 validation process is implemented in the hospital <u>or pharmacy</u>.

Sec. 5. Section 38-28,106, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
24 2018, is amended to read:

25 38-28,106 An employee or agent of a prescribing practitioner may 26 communicate a prescription, chart order, or refill authorization issued 27 by the prescribing practitioner to a pharmacist or a pharmacist intern 28 except for an emergency oral authorization for a controlled substance 29 listed in Schedule II of section 28-405. An employee or agent of a 30 prescribing practitioner may communicate <u>a prescription or a</u> refill 31 authorization issued by the prescribing practitioner to a pharmacy

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1 technician.

Sec. 6. Section 71-2483, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
amended to read:

71-2483 An employee or agent of a prescribing practitioner may 4 communicate a prescription, chart order, or refill authorization issued 5 by the prescribing practitioner to a pharmacist or a pharmacist intern 6 except for an emergency oral authorization for a controlled substance 7 8 listed in Schedule II of section 28-405. An employee or agent of a 9 prescribing practitioner may communicate <u>a prescription or a</u> refill authorization issued by the prescribing practitioner to a pharmacy 10 11 technician.
