Section 1. Section 48-148, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

3 (1) If any employee, or his or her dependents in case of 48-148 death, of any employer subject to the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Act 4 5 files any claim with, or accepts any payment from such employer, or from any insurance company carrying such risk, on account of personal injury, 6 7 or makes any agreement, or submits any question to the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Court under such act, such action shall constitute a release 8 9 to such employer of all claims or demands at law, if any, arising from 10 such injury.

11 (2) This section does not apply to a claim against a workers' compensation insurer or its agents for bad faith denial of workers' 12 compensation benefits. An injured employee has a claim for bad faith 13 denial of workers' compensation benefits if the insurer or its agent 14 denied benefits or authorization of benefits without a reasonable basis 15 16 at the time of the denial, and the insurer or its agent knew or should 17 have known there was no reasonable basis for denial, or if the insurer engages in any acts or practices described in subsection (2) of section 18 19 48-146.02.

<u>(3) Any claim of bad faith denial of workers' compensation benefits</u>
 <u>pursuant to subsection (2) of this section may be brought in a civil</u>
 <u>action in any court of competent jurisdiction within five years after the</u>
 <u>cause of action accrues.</u>
