- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to define terms; to require
- 2 development and implementation of a statewide school panic button
- 3 program; to provide powers and duties; and to state intent regarding
- 4 appropriations.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

LB1156 2020

- 1 Section 1. (1) For purposes of this section:
- 2 (a) Department means the State Department of Education;
- 3 (b) Key public safety personnel means first responders, including
- 4 the local police department, fire department, and emergency medical
- 5 services;
- 6 (c) 911 call has the definition found in section 86-1017;
- 7 (d) 911 service system has the definition found in section 86-1019;
- 8 <u>(e) Program means the statewide school panic button program</u>
- 9 <u>developed under this section;</u>
- 10 (f) Public safety answering point has the definition found in
- 11 section 86-1022;
- 12 (g) Push notification means an automated text message sent by an
- 13 application on a mobile telephone to a user when the application is not
- 14 open;
- 15 (h) School means a public elementary or secondary school; and
- 16 (i) Short message service means a text messaging service component
- 17 <u>of most telephone, Internet, and mobile device systems that uses</u>
- 18 <u>standardized communication protocols to enable mobile devices to exchange</u>
- 19 <u>short text messages.</u>
- 20 <u>(2)(a) By September 30, 2020, the department shall develop a</u>
- 21 <u>statewide school panic button program available to schools in Nebraska.</u>
- 22 At a minimum, the department shall complete the following activities when
- 23 <u>developing the program:</u>
- 24 (i) Secure a statewide contract with one or more technology
- 25 providers necessary to operate the program;
- 26 (ii) If available through the Department of Administrative Services,
- 27 <u>use an existing state contract to expedite and procure the program; and</u>
- 28 (iii) Assume the cost of having the technology implemented in all
- 29 <u>schools</u>.
- 30 (b) The vendor shall have a demonstrated track record of deploying
- 31 technology for a school panic button program on a statewide basis with at

- 1 least one successful statewide implementation covering a minimum of one
- 2 <u>thousand public schools.</u>
- 3 (c) The vendor shall also have demonstrated success in the State of
- 4 Nebraska by identifying school districts that are participating in a
- 5 panic button program as of the effective date of this act or that have
- 6 previously participated in a panic button program.
- 7 (3) The technology purchased for the program shall meet the
- 8 following standards:
- 9 (a) The technology must be usable through a mobile telephone
- 10 application-based system; and
- 11 (b) The mobile telephone application-based system must be able to be
- 12 <u>optionally integrated with the public safety answering point and to do</u>
- 13 the following:
- 14 (i) Place a standard voice call to 911;
- 15 (ii) Communicate with and allow the 911 service system to send
- 16 followup messages;
- 17 <u>(iii) Send short message service text messages, email, and push</u>
- 18 <u>notifications to authorized users onsite at the school, including</u>
- 19 teachers and staff at the school and key public safety personnel;
- 20 <u>(iv) Actively monitor all 911 calls processed by the public safety</u>
- 21 answering point, including standard landline, mobile, and panic-button-
- 22 application calls;
- 23 (v) Allow the 911 service system or public safety officials to
- 24 convert a standard 911 call made from a landline or mobile telephone
- 25 processed by the 911 service system to a panic-button-application event
- 26 <u>from within the 911 service system, including intake, dispatch, and</u>
- 27 supervisory workflows of the 911 service system;
- 28 (vi) Allow the 911 service system or public safety officials to
- 29 initiate panic-button-application events and to initiate a communication
- 30 to declare a panic-button-application event outside of a 911 call to
- 31 facilitate communications and coordination before, during, and after an

- 1 event; and
- 2 (vii) Automatically present information from a school to the 911
- 3 call taker, including floor plans and building information, without
- 4 further action by the 911 call taker when a 911 call from a landline or
- 5 mobile phone or panic-button-application activation occurs.
- 6 (4) The mobile telephone application-based system shall contain, at
- 7 least, the following event categories:
- 8 (a) Active Assailant/Shooter;
- 9 (b) Medical Emergency;
- 10 (c) Police;
- 11 <u>(d) Fire; and</u>
- 12 (e) Other 911.
- 13 (5) The mobile telephone application-based system shall allow for
- 14 the geo-fencing of a school campus that generates a panic button
- 15 <u>notification inside the school property and a regular 911 call outside</u>
- 16 the school property.
- 17 (6) The State Department of Education shall ensure that the mobile
- 18 telephone application-based system selected for the program is certified
- 19 by the United States Department of Homeland Security under the federal
- 20 Support Anti-Terrorism by Fostering Effective Technologies Act of 2002.
- 21 (7) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate two million
- 22 dollars for fiscal year 2020-21 to the State Department of Education for
- 23 the purpose of implementing this section.
