- 2 28-101, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019; to create the offense of
- 3 sexual exploitation of a student; to define terms; to harmonize
- 4 provisions; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 28-101, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 28-101 Sections 28-101 to 28-1357 and 28-1601 to 28-1603 <u>and section</u>
- 4 2 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Criminal
- 5 Code.
- 6 Sec. 2. (1) A school official commits the offense of sexual
- 7 exploitation of a student if such school official engages in sexual
- 8 penetration or sexual contact with a student prior to one year following
- 9 such school student:
- 10 (a) Graduating from school; or
- 11 (b) Otherwise ceasing to be enrolled in school.
- 12 (2) A violation of this section is a Class II felony.
- 13 (3) It is not a defense to a charge under this section that the
- 14 <u>school student consented to the sexual penetration or sexual contact.</u>
- 15 (4) For purposes of this section:
- 16 (a) School means a school under the jurisdiction of a school board
- 17 <u>authorized by Chapter 79 or under the governing authority of a private,</u>
- 18 denominational, or parochial school;
- 19 (b)(i) School official means an individual who is nineteen years of
- 20 age or older and who is a teacher, school official, school administrator,
- 21 coach, school employee, or a volunteer acting as a teacher or coach or as
- 22 an assistant to a teacher or coach;
- 23 (ii) School official does not include a school student assisting a
- 24 school official;
- 25 (c) Sexual contact has the same meaning as in section 28-318; and
- 26 (d) Sexual penetration has the same meaning as in section 28-318.
