- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Game Law; to amend section 37-455,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to provide for special
- 3 landowner deer hunting permits as prescribed; to provide a duty for
- 4 the Game and Parks Commission; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 37-455, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 37-455 (1) The commission may issue a limited permit for deer, antelope, wild turkey, or elk to a person who is a qualifying landowner 4 or leaseholder and his or her immediate family as described in this 5 section. The commission may issue nonresident landowner limited permits 6 after preference has been given for the issuance of resident permits as 7 provided in rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the 8 9 commission. Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, a A permit shall be valid during the predetermined period established by the 10 commission pursuant to sections 37-447 to 37-450, 37-452, 37-456, or 11 37-457. Upon receipt of an application in proper form as prescribed by 12 the rules and regulations of the commission, the commission may issue (a) 13 a limited deer, antelope, or wild turkey permit valid for hunting on all 14 of the land which is owned or leased by the qualifying landowner or 15 16 leaseholder if such lands are identified in the application or (b) a limited elk permit valid for hunting on the entire elk management unit of 17 which the land of the qualifying landowner or leaseholder included in the 18 19 application is a part.

The commission shall adopt and promulgate rules 20 (2)(a) regulations prescribing procedures and forms and create requirements for 21 documentation by an applicant or permittee to determine whether the 22 23 applicant or permittee is a Nebraska resident and is a qualifying 24 landowner or leaseholder of the described property or is a member of the 25 immediate family of such qualifying landowner or leaseholder. The commission may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations that create 26 requirements for documentation to designate one qualifying landowner 27 28 among partners of a partnership or officers or shareholders of a corporation that owns or leases eighty acres or more of farm or ranch 29 land for agricultural purposes and among beneficiaries of a trust that 30 31 leases eighty acres or more of farm or ranch land for owns or

- 1 agricultural purposes. Only a person who is a qualifying landowner or
- 2 leaseholder and such person's immediate family may apply for a limited
- 3 permit. An applicant may apply for no more than one permit per species
- 4 per year except as otherwise provided in subsection (4) of this section
- 5 <u>and</u> the rules and regulations of the commission. For purposes of this
- 6 section, immediate family means and is limited to a husband and wife and
- 7 their children or siblings sharing ownership in the property.
- 8 (b) The conditions applicable to permits issued pursuant to sections
- 9 37-447 to 37-450, 37-452, 37-456, or 37-457, whichever is appropriate,
- 10 shall apply to limited permits issued pursuant to this section, except
- 11 that the commission may pass commission orders for species harvest
- 12 allocation pertaining to the sex and age of the species harvested which
- 13 are different for a limited permit than for other hunting permits. For
- 14 purposes of this section, white-tailed deer and mule deer shall be
- 15 treated as one species.
- 16 (3)(a) To qualify for a limited permit to hunt deer or antelope, the
- 17 applicant shall be a Nebraska resident who (i) owns or leases eighty
- 18 acres or more of farm or ranch land for agricultural purposes or a member
- 19 of such person's immediate family or (ii) is the partner, officer,
- 20 shareholder, or beneficiary designated as the qualifying landowner by a
- 21 partnership, corporation, or trust as provided in the rules and
- 22 regulations under subdivision (2)(a) of this section or a member of the
- 23 immediate family of the partner, officer, shareholder, or beneficiary.
- 24 The number of limited permits issued annually per species for each farm
- 25 or ranch shall not exceed the total acreage of the farm or ranch divided
- 26 by eighty. The fee for a limited permit to hunt deer or antelope shall be
- 27 one-half the fee for the regular permit for such species.
- 28 (b) A nonresident of Nebraska who owns three hundred twenty acres or
- 29 more of farm or ranch land in the State of Nebraska for agricultural
- 30 purposes or a member of such person's immediate family may apply for a
- 31 limited deer or antelope permit. The number of limited permits issued

- 1 annually per species for each farm or ranch shall not exceed the total
- 2 acreage of the farm or ranch divided by three hundred twenty. The fee for
- 3 such a permit to hunt deer or antelope shall be one-half the fee for a
- 4 nonresident permit to hunt such species.
- 5 (c) The commission may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations
- 6 providing for the issuance of an additional limited deer permit to a
- 7 qualified individual for the taking of a deer without antlers at a fee
- 8 equal to or less than the fee for the original limited permit.
- 9 (4)(a) In addition to any limited permit to hunt deer issued to a
- 10 qualifying landowner under subsection (3) of this section, the commission
- 11 <u>shall issue upto four free firearm deer hunting permits to hunt deer</u>
- 12 <u>during the seven days immediately preceding the beginning date for the</u>
- 13 <u>firearm deer hunting season to any landowner and designated members of</u>
- 14 his or her immediate family if such landowner consents to make fifty
- 15 percent or more of his or her farm or ranch land located in any single
- 16 <u>commission-designated deer management unit available for public deer</u>
- 17 <u>hunting during the firearm deer hunting season by any holder of a valid</u>
- 18 <u>firearm deer hunting permit.</u> For purposes of this subsection, the
- 19 qualifying criteria for a Nebraska resident described in subdivisions (3)
- 20 (a)(i) and (ii) of this section and the ownership criteria for a
- 21 nonresident of Nebraska described in subdivision (3)(b) of this section
- 22 <u>apply.</u>
- 23 <u>(b) The consent described in subdivision (a) of this subsection</u>
- 24 shall be made in writing on a form prescribed by the commission and
- 25 delivered to the commission beginning the second Monday in July but no
- 26 <u>later than August 31. Such consent shall include a legal description of</u>
- 27 the particular farm or ranch land owned by the landowner in the deer
- 28 management unit made available for public deer hunting during the firearm
- 29 <u>deer hunting season as described in this subsection. The location of such</u>
- 30 farm or ranch land shall be published on the commission's web site.
- 31 (c) The commission shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations

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1 to carry out the purposes of this subsection.

 $(5)(a) \frac{(4)(a)}{(5)(a)}$ To qualify for a limited permit to hunt wild turkey, 2 the applicant shall be a Nebraska resident who (i) owns or leases eighty 3 acres or more of farm or ranch land for agricultural purposes or a member 4 of such person's immediate family or (ii) is the partner, officer, 5 shareholder, or beneficiary designated as the qualifying landowner by a 6 7 partnership, corporation, or trust as provided in the rules and 8 regulations under subdivision (2)(a) of this section or a member of the immediate family of the partner, officer, shareholder, or beneficiary. 9 10 The number of limited permits issued annually per season for each farm or ranch shall not exceed the total acreage of the farm or ranch divided by 11 12 eighty. An applicant may apply for no more than one limited permit per season. The fee for a limited permit to hunt wild turkey shall be one-13 half the fee for the regular permit to hunt wild turkey. 14

- (b) A nonresident of Nebraska who owns three hundred twenty acres or more of farm or ranch land in the State of Nebraska for agricultural purposes or a member of such person's immediate family may apply for a limited permit to hunt wild turkey. Only one limited wild turkey permit per three hundred twenty acres may be issued annually for each wild turkey season under this subdivision. The fee for such a permit to hunt shall be one-half the fee for a nonresident permit to hunt wild turkey.
- (6) (5) To qualify for a limited permit to hunt elk, (a) the 22 23 applicant shall be (i) a Nebraska resident who owns three hundred twenty 24 acres or more of farm or ranch land for agricultural purposes, (ii) a Nebraska resident who leases six hundred forty acres or more of farm or 25 ranch land for agricultural purposes or has a leasehold interest and an 26 ownership interest in farm or ranch land used for agricultural purposes 27 which when added together totals at least six hundred forty acres, (iii) 28 a nonresident of Nebraska who owns at least one thousand two hundred 29 eighty acres of farm or ranch land for agricultural purposes, or (iv) a 30 31 member of such owner's or lessee's immediate family and (b) the

Nebraska, is repealed.

1 qualifying farm or ranch land of the applicant shall be within an area 2 designated as an elk management zone by the commission in its rules and 3 regulations. An applicant shall not be issued a limited bull elk permit more than once every three years, and the commission may give preference 4 to a person who did not receive a limited elk permit or a specified type 5 6 of limited elk permit during the previous years. The fee for a resident landowner limited permit to hunt elk shall not exceed one-half the fee 7 8 for the regular permit to hunt elk. The fee for a nonresident landowner limited permit to hunt elk shall not exceed three times the cost of a 9 resident elk permit. The number of applications allowed for limited elk 10 permits for each farm or ranch shall not exceed the total acreage of the 11 farm or ranch divided by the minimum acreage requirements established for 12 the property. No more than one person may qualify for the same described 13 property. 14
