- 2 28-310.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
- 3 provisions relating to strangulation; to prohibit suffocation; to
- 4 change penalties; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 28-310.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,

- 2 is amended to read:
- 3 28-310.01 (1) A person commits the offense of assault by
- 4 strangulation or suffocation if the person intentionally, knowingly, or
- 5 <u>recklessly:</u>
- 6 (a) Impedes intentionally impedes the normal breathing or
- 7 circulation of the blood of another person by applying pressure on the
- 8 throat or neck of the other person; -
- 9 (b) Impedes the normal breathing of another person by covering the
- 10 mouth or nose of the person; or
- 11 (c) Otherwise impedes the normal breathing of another person.
- 12 (2) An offense is committed under this section regardless of whether
- 13 <u>a visible injury resulted.</u>
- 14 (3) (2) Except as provided in subsection (4) (3) of this section, \underline{a}
- 15 violation of this section strangulation is a Class IIIA felony.
- 16 <u>(4) A violation of this section</u> (3) Strangulation is a Class IIA
- 17 felony if:
- 18 (a) The person used or attempted to use a dangerous instrument while
- 19 committing the offense;
- 20 (b) The person caused serious bodily injury to the other person
- 21 while committing the offense; or
- 22 (c) The person has been previously convicted of a violation of this
- 23 <u>section; or strangulation.</u>
- (d) The offense was committed against a pregnant woman.
- (5) (4) It is an affirmative defense that an act constituting
- 26 strangulation or suffocation was the result of a legitimate medical
- 27 procedure.
