1 Section 1. Section 38-1708, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 3 38-1708 The Massage Therapy Practice Act shall not be construed to
- 4 require licensure of include the following classes of persons:
- 5 (1) Licensed physicians and surgeons, osteopathic physicians,
- 6 chiropractors, registered nurses, practical nurses, cosmetologists,
- 7 estheticians, nail technicians, physical therapists, barbers, and other
- 8 persons credentialed under the Uniform Credentialing Act who are
- 9 exclusively engaged in the practice of their respective professions;
- 10 (2) Physicians who serve in the armed forces of the United States or
- 11 the United States Public Health Service or who are employed by the United
- 12 States Department of Veterans Affairs or other federal agencies, if their
- 13 practice is limited to that service or employment;
- 14 (3) Students performing massage therapy services when they render
- 15 such services within the scope of an approved massage therapy school
- 16 under the supervision of a licensed massage therapist; and
- 17 (4) Individuals who hold a current license as a massage therapist in
- 18 another state and who travel with and provide massage therapy services to
- 19 theatrical groups, entertainers, or athletic organizations; and -
- 20 (5) Individuals engaged in the practice of reflexology who limit
- 21 their services to the application of specific pressure, by the use of the
- 22 practitioner's hands, thumbs, and fingers, to the soft tissue of the
- 23 <u>hands, feet, and outer ears and whose services are not designated or</u>
- 24 implied to be massage or massage therapy.
