- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Wage and Hour Act; to amend section
- 2 48-1203, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2018; to provide
- for an annual adjustment to the minimum wage; to provide duties for
- 4 the State Treasurer and Department of Labor; to define a term; and
- 5 to repeal the original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 48-1203, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2018, is amended to read:
- 3 48-1203 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section and section
- 4 48-1203.01, every employer shall pay to each of his or her employees a
- 5 minimum wage of:
- 6 (a) Seven dollars and twenty-five cents per hour through December
- 7 31, 2014;
- 8 (b) Eight dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2015, through
- 9 December 31, 2015;—and
- 10 (c) Nine dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2016 through April
- 11 <u>1, 2020; and</u> -
- 12 (d) The amount set pursuant to subsection (2) of this section on and
- 13 <u>after April 1, 2020.</u>
- 14 (2)(a) By January 31, 2020, and on or before each January 31
- 15 thereafter, the State Treasurer shall adjust the minimum wage by an
- 16 <u>amount determined by the State Treasurer at the end of the preceding</u>
- 17 <u>calendar year to reflect the average annual percentage change in the</u>
- 18 <u>consumer price index for the most recent five-year period for which data</u>
- 19 is available. The minimum wage so adjusted shall be rounded to the
- 20 <u>nearest cent divisible by five. Such minimum wage shall become effective</u>
- 21 <u>beginning April 1 of such year.</u>
- 22 (b) An annual increase under this subsection shall not exceed three
- 23 <u>and one-half percent.</u>
- 24 (c) By February 1, 2020, and on or before each February 1
- 25 thereafter, the Department of Labor shall post on the department's web
- 26 <u>site the adjusted minimum wage that will take effect April 1 of such</u>
- 27 <u>year.</u>
- 28 (d) As used in this subsection, consumer price index means the
- 29 <u>Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, as prepared by the United</u>
- 30 States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- 31 (3) (2) For persons compensated by way of gratuities such as

- 1 waitresses, waiters, hotel bellhops, porters, and shoeshine persons, the
- 2 employer shall pay wages at the minimum rate of two dollars and thirteen
- 3 cents per hour, plus all gratuities given to them for services rendered.
- 4 The sum of wages and gratuities received by each person compensated by
- 5 way of gratuities shall equal or exceed the minimum wage rate provided in
- 6 subsection (1) of this section. In determining whether or not the
- 7 individual is compensated by way of gratuities, the burden of proof shall
- 8 be upon the employer.
- 9 (4) (3) Any employer employing student-learners as part of a bona
- 10 fide vocational training program shall pay such student-learners' wages
- at a rate of at least seventy-five percent of the minimum wage rate which
- 12 would otherwise be applicable.
