- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Uniform Credentialing Act; to amend section 38-167, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 38-101 and 38-121, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2018; to adopt the Art Therapy Practice Act; to create a board; to eliminate obsolete provisions; to harmonize provisions; to provide an operative date; and to repeal the original sections.

- 31 Sec. 4. Sections 4 to 15 of this act shall be known and may be

- 1 cited as the Art Therapy Practice Act.
- Sec. 5. For purposes of the Art Therapy Practice Act and elsewhere
- 3 in the Uniform Credentialing Act, unless the context otherwise requires,
- 4 the definitions found in sections 6 to 9 of this act apply.
- 5 Sec. 6. <u>Accredited institution means a university or college</u>
- 6 accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency of institutions
- 7 of higher education, or an institution or clinical program approved by
- 8 <u>the American Art Therapy Association.</u>
- 9 Sec. 7. <u>Board means the Board of Art Therapy.</u>
- 10 Sec. 8. Licensed professional art therapist means a person who has
- 11 <u>completed a master's or doctoral degree program in art therapy, or an</u>
- 12 <u>equivalent course of study, from an accredited educational institution,</u>
- 13 has completed all of the requirements set out in the Uniform
- 14 Credentialing Act, and has been issued a license by the board for the
- independent practice of art therapy.
- Sec. 9. <u>Practice of professional art therapy means the integrated</u>
- 17 use of psychotherapeutic principles, visual art media, and the creative
- 18 process in the assessment, treatment, and remediation of psychosocial,
- 19 emotional, cognitive, physical, and developmental disorders in children,
- 20 <u>adolescents</u>, <u>adults</u>, <u>families</u>, <u>and groups</u>.
- 21 Sec. 10. (1) No person shall use the title licensed professional
- 22 art therapist or use the abbreviation LPAT or a title or letters that are
- 23 substantially the same or hold himself or herself out as a licensed
- 24 professional art therapist unless he or she is licensed by the board.
- 25 (2) No person shall engage in the practice of art therapy unless he
- or she is licensed by the board.
- 27 Sec. 11. An individual who is a graduate student in art therapy and
- 28 who is practicing under the supervision of a licensed professional art
- 29 <u>therapist is exempt from the licensure requirements of the Art Therapy</u>
- 30 <u>Practice Act.</u>
- 31 Sec. 12. (1) An applicant for licensure as a licensed professional

- 1 art therapist shall at the time of application provide proof to the
- 2 <u>department</u> that he or she meets one or more of the following
- 3 qualifications:
- 4 (a) Graduation after successful completion of art therapy curriculum
- 5 requirements of an accredited college or university approved by the
- 6 board; or
- 7 <u>(b) Graduation with a four-year degree from an accredited college or</u>
- 8 <u>university and completion of at least two consecutive years, military</u>
- 9 <u>duty excepted</u>, as a student art therapist under the supervision of a
- 10 licensed professional art therapist approved by the board.
- 11 (2) In order to be licensed as a professional art therapist, an
- 12 applicant shall, in addition to the requirements of subsection (1) of
- 13 this section, successfully complete an examination approved by the board.
- 14 Sec. 13. An applicant for licensure as a professional art therapist
- 15 who has met the education and examination requirements in section 12 of
- 16 this act, who passed the examination more than three years prior to the
- 17 time of application for licensure, and who is not practicing at the time
- 18 of application for licensure shall present proof satisfactory to the
- 19 department that he or she has within the three years immediately
- 20 preceding the application for licensure completed continuing competency
- 21 requirements approved by the board pursuant to section 38-145.
- 22 Sec. 14. (1) An applicant for licensure as a professional art
- 23 therapist who has met the standards set by the board pursuant to section
- 24 38-126 for a license based on licensure in another jurisdiction but is
- 25 not practicing at the time of application for licensure shall present
- 26 proof satisfactory to the department that he or she has within the three
- 27 years immediately preceding the application for licensure completed
- 28 <u>continuing competency requirements approved by the board pursuant to</u>
- 29 section 38-145.
- 30 (2) An applicant who is a military spouse may apply for a temporary
- 31 license as provided in section 38-129.01.

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1 Sec. 15. The department shall establish and collect fees for

- 2 <u>initial licensure and renewal under the Art Therapy Practice Act as</u>
- 3 provided in sections 38-151 to 38-157.
- 4 Sec. 16. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2020.
- 5 Sec. 17. Original section 38-167, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 6 Nebraska, and sections 38-101 and 38-121, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 7 Supplement, 2018, are repealed.
