- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Liquor Control Act; to amend
- 2 sections 53-105 and 53-106, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to
- 3 change provisions relating to membership of the Nebraska Liquor
- 4 Control Commission; and to repeal the original sections.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 53-105, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
2 amended to read:

3 53-105 There is hereby created the Nebraska Liquor Control
4 Commission, consisting of five ~~three~~ members to be appointed by the
5 Governor, subject to confirmation by a majority of the members elected to
6 the Legislature, no more than two of whom shall be members of the same
7 political party, and no three ~~two~~ shall be citizens of the same
8 congressional district.

9 Sec. 2. Section 53-106, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
10 amended to read:

11 53-106 The Governor shall appoint five ~~three~~ members of the
12 commission, one of whom he shall designate as chairman. At the expiration
13 of the next term, the Governor shall appoint three members, two of whom
14 shall be appointed for terms of six years and one of whom shall be
15 appointed for a term of four years. Except for the initial appointment of
16 such member appointed for four years, each member ~~One member shall be~~
17 ~~appointed every two years and~~ shall hold office for a period of six
18 years. Any appointee may be removed by the Governor, after an opportunity
19 to be heard, for malfeasance, misfeasance or neglect in office. No person
20 shall be appointed to the commission, or continue to hold that office
21 after appointment, while holding any other office or position under the
22 laws of this state, any other state, or of the United States.

23 Sec. 3. Original sections 53-105 and 53-106, Reissue Revised
24 Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
