- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to teachers; to adopt the Alternative
- 2 Certification for Quality Teachers Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 4 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 <u>cited as the Alternative Certification for Quality Teachers Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. The Legislature finds and declares that:
- 4 (1) Like many other states, Nebraska is facing a teacher and
- 5 <u>substitute teacher shortage;</u>
- 6 (2) Mandatory training days and family leave policies draw many
- 7 regular teachers out of their classrooms, causing schools to hire
- 8 substitute teachers;
- 9 (3) The Internal Revenue Service requires a separation period for
- 10 <u>recently retired teachers who may otherwise be interested in returning to</u>
- 11 the classroom as a substitute teacher;
- 12 (4) In the fall of 2016, the State Department of Education conducted
- 13 <u>a teacher vacancy survey of all school districts, educational service</u>
- 14 units, and nonpublic school systems;
- 15 (5) Such survey showed that the state continues to have hundreds of
- 16 unfilled teaching positions across the state;
- 17 (6) The most widely reported solutions for filling teaching
- 18 vacancies were to hire an individual who holds a transitional,
- 19 provisional, or temporary teaching certificate; and
- 20 <u>(7) Filling teaching vacancies and having an adequate number of</u>
- 21 substitute teachers is imperative for delivering a high quality learning
- 22 experience to students.
- Sec. 3. (1) In addition to certificates issued pursuant to sections
- 24 79-806 to 79-815, a certificate to teach in the public schools shall be
- 25 granted by the State Board of Education to any person in good standing
- 26 <u>who possesses a valid teaching certificate from another state and who</u>
- 27 <u>annually completes the requirements to maintain certification pursuant to</u>
- 28 rules and regulations of the board.
- 29 <u>(2) Issuance of a certificate to teach in the public schools</u>
- 30 pursuant to this section shall be subject to a criminal history record
- 31 information check pursuant to section 79-814.01 and any rules and

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1 regulations adopted and promulgated by the board to carry out this

- 2 <u>section</u>.
- 3 Sec. 4. (1) In addition to certificates issued pursuant to sections
- 4 79-806 to 79-815, a temporary certificate to teach in the public schools
- 5 <u>may be granted by the State Board of Education to any person who has:</u>
- 6 (a) Presented to the board a valid bachelor's degree, or higher,
- 7 from an accredited degree-awarding college or university;
- 8 (b) Passed the basic skills examination and appropriate subject area
- 9 <u>examination as designated by the board; and</u>
- 10 (c) Enrolled in an alternative teacher certification program
- 11 <u>approved by the board.</u>
- 12 (2) Any temporary certificate to teach in the public schools issued
- 13 pursuant to this section shall be valid for a period not to exceed two
- 14 years, during which the holder of such temporary certificate must obtain
- 15 a valid certificate to teach in the public schools through an alternative
- 16 teacher certification program approved by the board.
- 17 (3) Issuance of a temporary certificate to teach in the public
- 18 schools pursuant to this section shall be subject to a criminal history
- 19 record information check pursuant to section 79-814.01 and any rules and
- 20 regulations adopted and promulgated by the board to carry out this
- 21 <u>section</u>.
