- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to state intent relating to
- 2 appropriations for apprenticeships; and to provide powers and duties
- 3 for the Department of Labor.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate
- 2 <u>four million dollars from the General Fund to the Department of Labor for</u>
- 3 fiscal year 2020-21 for purposes described in this section.
- 4 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to reduce the shortage of
- 5 highly skilled workers, encourage employers to hire and train apprentices
- 6 <u>in highly skilled trades and occupations, encourage nontraditional</u>
- 7 <u>workers to engage in highly skilled trades and occupations, and authorize</u>
- 8 grants and stipends for certain apprenticeship training expenses.
- 9 (3) The department may use the funds appropriated pursuant to this
- 10 section to:
- 11 <u>(a) Expand existing initiatives to provide technical assistance to</u>
- 12 employers establishing or expanding registered apprenticeship and
- 13 preapprenticeship programs, including assisting prospective employers
- 14 through each step of the registered apprenticeship process, coordinating
- 15 <u>resources and assisting employers in the drafting of apprenticeship</u>
- 16 standards, helping employers recruit apprentices, including women and
- 17 English-as-a-second-language learners, and facilitating collaboration
- 18 with institutions of higher education;
- 19 (b) Develop, administer, and provide grants for employers partnering
- 20 with the department in establishing registered apprenticeship and
- 21 preapprenticeship programs. Grants may be provided to employers for
- 22 equipment, curriculum, stipends, staff development, or startup costs
- 23 needed to participate in existing state apprenticeship initiatives; and
- 24 (c) Provide grants to employers which partner with an institution of
- 25 higher education for the purpose of providing tuition assistance,
- 26 <u>stipends, or both to registered apprentices for tools, books, or supplies</u>
- 27 <u>needed to complete the apprenticeship.</u>
- 28 (4) The department shall develop criteria for and administer the
- 29 grants. The department shall annually provide an electronic report to the
- 30 Legislature which includes the grants awarded, grant amounts, number of
- 31 apprentices participating in each program, trades and occupations in

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1 which apprentices are working, average wages for apprentices, and

2 geographic location of grant recipients.
