- 3 pursuit of, application for, or implementation of a federal waiver

- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 68-992, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 68-992 (1) Eligibility for medical assistance shall be expanded to
- 4 include certain adults ages nineteen through sixty-four whose income is
- 5 equal to or less than one hundred thirty-eight percent of the federal
- 6 poverty level, as authorized and using the income methodology defined by
- 7 42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)(10)(A)(i)(VIII) and related federal regulations and
- 8 guidance, as such statute, regulations, and guidance existed on January
- 9 1, 2018.
- 10 (2) On or before April 1, 2019, in order to ensure that eligibility
- 11 for medical assistance is expanded as required by this section, the
- 12 Department of Health and Human Services shall submit a state plan
- 13 amendment and all other necessary documents seeking required approvals or
- 14 waivers to the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
- 15 (3) The Department of Health and Human Services shall take all
- 16 actions necessary to maximize federal financial participation in funding
- 17 medical assistance pursuant to this section.
- 18 (4) No greater or additional burdens or restrictions on eligibility,
- 19 enrollment, benefits, or access to health care services shall be imposed
- 20 on persons eligible for medical assistance pursuant to this section than
- 21 on any other population eligible for medical assistance.
- 22 (5) This section shall apply notwithstanding any other provision of
- 23 law or federal waiver.
- 24 (6) The department shall not pursue, apply for, or implement any
- 25 experimental, pilot, or demonstration project waiver under section 1115
- 26 of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. 1315, to expand eligibility for
- 27 <u>medical assistance to persons eligible under this section.</u>
