- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to children; to amend section 28-101, Revised
- 2 Statutes Supplement, 2019; to provide for immunity from criminal and
- 3 civil liability for removal of a child from a motor vehicle by
- 4 forcible entry as prescribed; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal
- 5 the original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 28-101, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is

- 3 28-101 Sections 28-101 to 28-1357 and 28-1601 to 28-1603 and section
- 4 2 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Criminal
- 5 Code.
- 6 Sec. 2. (1) A person is immune from civil and criminal liability
- 7 for property damage resulting from such person's forcible entry into a
- 8 <u>locked motor vehicle to remove and rescue a child locked or trapped</u>
- 9 inside the motor vehicle if:
- 10 (a) The person had a good faith and reasonable belief, based upon
- 11 the circumstances, that entry into the motor vehicle was necessary
- 12 because the child was in imminent danger of suffering harm or death;
- 13 (b) Before entering the motor vehicle, the person determined that
- 14 the motor vehicle was locked and there was no other reasonable method for
- 15 the child to exit the motor vehicle without assistance;
- 16 (c) Before or as soon as reasonably practicable after entering the
- 17 motor vehicle, the person notified law enforcement or emergency services;
- 18 <u>(d) The person used no more force than reasonably necessary to enter</u>
- 19 the motor vehicle and remove the child; and
- 20 <u>(e) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the person</u>
- 21 remained with the child in a safe location, in reasonable proximity to
- 22 the motor vehicle, until one of the following arrived:
- 23 (i) Law enforcement or emergency services personnel;
- 24 (ii) A firefighter;
- 25 (iii) A parent, guardian, or adult relative of the child; or
- 26 <u>(iv) The owner or operator of the motor vehicle.</u>
- 27 (2) If the person rendering assistance must leave the area before
- 28 the arrival of a person described in subdivision (1)(e) of this section
- 29 <u>in order to protect the health or safety of the child, the person</u>
- 30 rendering assistance, or any other person, the person rendering
- 31 <u>assistance shall:</u>

- 1 (a) Before leaving or as soon as reasonably practicable thereafter,
- 2 <u>contact law enforcement or emergency services and notify them of the</u>
- 3 <u>situation; and</u>
- 4 (b) If reasonably practicable, leave a written notice on the
- 5 <u>windshield of the motor vehicle that includes the person's name and</u>
- 6 contact information and a description of where the person has taken the
- 7 <u>child.</u>
