## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 903**

- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; to amend sections 60-301,
   60-393, 60-395, 60-396, 60-3,104, and 60-3,130.04, Revised Statutes
   Supplement, 2019; to provide for Down Syndrome Awareness License
   Plates; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
   sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 60-301, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is
 amended to read:

3 60-301 Sections 60-301 to 60-3,244 <u>and sections 7 and 8 of this act</u>
4 shall be known and may be cited as the Motor Vehicle Registration Act.

5 Sec. 2. Section 60-393, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is6 amended to read:

7 60-393 Any owner who has two or more motor vehicles or trailers required to be registered under the Motor Vehicle Registration Act may 8 9 register all such motor vehicles or trailers on a calendar-year basis or 10 on an annual basis for the same registration period beginning in a month chosen by the owner. When electing to establish the same registration 11 period for all such motor vehicles or trailers, the owner shall pay the 12 13 registration fee, the motor vehicle tax imposed in section 60-3,185, the motor vehicle fee imposed in section 60-3,190, and the alternative fuel 14 fee imposed in section 60-3,191 on each motor vehicle for the number of 15 16 months necessary to extend its current registration period to the registration period under which all such motor vehicles or trailers will 17 be registered. Credit shall be given for registration paid on each motor 18 vehicle or trailer when the motor vehicle or trailer has a later 19 expiration date than that chosen by the owner except as otherwise 20 provided in sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 21 60-3,128, 22 60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,233, 60-3,235, 60-3,238, 60-3,240, 60-3,242, and 23 60-3,244 and section 8 of this act. Thereafter all such motor vehicles or 24 trailers shall be registered on an annual basis starting in the month 25 chosen by the owner.

60-395 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this
section and sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128,
60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,231, 60-3,233, 60-3,235, 60-3,238, 60-3,240,
60-3,242, and 60-3,244 and section 8 of this act, the registration shall

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expire and the registered owner or lessee may, by returning the 1 2 registration certificate, the license plates, and, when appropriate, the validation decals and by either making application on a form prescribed 3 4 by the department to the county treasurer of the occurrence of an event 5 described in subdivisions (a) through (e) of this subsection or, in the case of a change in situs, displaying to the county treasurer the 6 7 registration certificate of such other state as evidence of a change in situs, receive a refund of that part of the unused fees and taxes on 8 9 motor vehicles or trailers based on the number of unexpired months remaining in the registration period from the date of any of the 10 following events: 11

12 (a) Upon transfer of ownership of any motor vehicle or trailer;

13 (b) In case of loss of possession because of fire, theft,14 dismantlement, or junking;

15 (c) When a salvage branded certificate of title is issued;

(d) Whenever a type or class of motor vehicle or trailer previously registered is subsequently declared by legislative act or court decision to be illegal or ineligible to be operated or towed on the public roads and no longer subject to registration fees, the motor vehicle tax imposed in section 60-3,185, the motor vehicle fee imposed in section 60-3,190, and the alternative fuel fee imposed in section 60-3,191;

(e) Upon a trade-in or surrender of a motor vehicle under a lease;or

(f) In case of a change in the situs of a motor vehicle or trailerto a location outside of this state.

(2) If the date of the event falls within the same calendar month in
which the motor vehicle or trailer is acquired, no refund shall be
allowed for such month.

(3) If the transferor or lessee acquires another motor vehicle at
the time of the transfer, trade-in, or surrender, the transferor or
lessee shall have the credit provided for in this section applied toward

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payment of the motor vehicle fees and taxes then owing. Otherwise, the
 transferor or lessee shall file a claim for refund with the county
 treasurer upon an application form prescribed by the department.

4 (4) The registered owner or lessee shall make a claim for refund or 5 credit of the fees and taxes for the unexpired months in the registration 6 period within sixty days after the date of the event or shall be deemed 7 to have forfeited his or her right to such refund or credit.

8 (5) For purposes of this section, the date of the event shall be: 9 (a) In the case of a transfer or loss, the date of the transfer or loss; 10 (b) in the case of a change in the situs, the date of registration in 11 another state; (c) in the case of a trade-in or surrender under a lease, 12 the date of trade-in or surrender; (d) in the case of a legislative act, 13 the effective date of the act; and (e) in the case of a court decision, 14 the date the decision is rendered.

(6) Application for registration or for reassignment of license
plates and, when appropriate, validation decals to another motor vehicle
or trailer shall be made within thirty days of the date of purchase.

(7) If a motor vehicle or trailer was reported stolen under section 60-178, a refund under this section shall not be reduced for a lost plate charge and a credit under this section may be reduced for a lost plate charge but the applicant shall not be required to pay the plate fee for new plates.

(8) The county treasurer shall refund the motor vehicle fee and registration fee from the fees which have not been transferred to the State Treasurer. The county treasurer shall make payment to the claimant from the undistributed motor vehicle taxes of the taxing unit where the tax money was originally distributed. No refund of less than two dollars shall be paid.

31 60-396 Whenever the registered owner files an application with the

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county treasurer showing that a motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer is 1 2 disabled and has been removed from service, the registered owner may, by returning the registration certificate, the license plates, and, when 3 4 appropriate, the validation decals or, in the case of the unavailability 5 of such registration certificate or certificates, license plates, or validation decals, then by making an affidavit to the county treasurer of 6 7 such disablement and removal from service, receive a credit for a portion of the registration fee from the fee deposited with the State Treasurer 8 9 at the time of registration based upon the number of unexpired months remaining in the registration year except as otherwise provided in 10 sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128, 11 60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,233, 60-3,235, 60-3,238, 60-3,240, 60-3,242, and 60-3,244 12 13 and section 8 of this act. The owner shall also receive a credit for the 14 unused portion of the motor vehicle tax and fee based upon the number of unexpired months remaining in the registration year. When the owner 15 16 registers a replacement motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer at the 17 time of filing such affidavit, the credit may be immediately applied against the registration fee and the motor vehicle tax and fee for the 18 replacement motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer. When no such 19 replacement motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer is so registered, the 20 county treasurer shall forward the application and affidavit, if any, to 21 the State Treasurer who shall determine the amount, if any, of the 22 allowable credit for the registration fee and issue a credit certificate 23 24 to the owner. For the motor vehicle tax and fee, the county treasurer shall determine the amount, if any, of the allowable credit and issue a 25 credit certificate to the owner. When such motor vehicle, trailer, or 26 semitrailer is removed from service within the same month in which it was 27 28 registered, no credits shall be allowed for such month. The credits may be applied against taxes and fees for new or replacement motor vehicles, 29 trailers, or semitrailers incurred within one year after cancellation of 30 registration of the motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer for which the 31

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credits were allowed. When any such motor vehicle, trailer, 1 or 2 semitrailer is reregistered within the same registration year in which its registration has been canceled, the taxes and fees shall be that 3 4 portion of the registration fee and the motor vehicle tax and fee for the 5 remainder of the registration year. Sec. 6. Section 60-3,130.04, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is
amended to read:

60-3,130.04 (1) An owner of a historical vehicle eligible for 4 5 registration under section 60-3,130 may use a license plate or plates designed by this state in the year corresponding to the model year when 6 7 the vehicle was manufactured in lieu of the plates designed pursuant to section 60-3,130.03 subject to the approval of the department. The 8 9 department shall inspect the plate or plates and may approve the plate or plates if it is determined that the model-year license plate or plates 10 are legible and serviceable and that the license plate numbers do not 11 conflict with or duplicate other numbers assigned and in use. 12 An original-issued license plate or plates that have been restored to 13 original condition may be used when approved by the department. 14

15 (2) The department may consult with a recognized car club in 16 determining whether the year of the license plate or plates to be used 17 corresponds to the model year when the vehicle was manufactured.

(3) If only one license plate is used on the vehicle, the license
plate shall be placed on the rear of the vehicle. The owner of a
historical vehicle may use only one plate on the vehicle even for years
in which two license plates were issued for vehicles in general.

22 (4) License plates used pursuant to this section corresponding to the year of manufacture of the vehicle shall not be personalized message 23 24 license plates, Pearl Harbor license plates, prisoner-of-war license plates, disabled veteran license plates, Purple Heart license plates, 25 amateur radio station license plates, Nebraska Cornhusker Spirit Plates, 26 handicapped or disabled person license plates, specialty license plates, 27 28 special interest motor vehicle license plates, Military Honor Plates, Nebraska 150 Sesquicentennial Plates, Breast Cancer Awareness Plates, 29 Prostate Cancer Awareness Plates, Down Syndrome Awareness License Plates, 30 Mountain Lion Conservation Plates, Choose Life License Plates, Native 31

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American Cultural Awareness and History Plates, Sammy's Superheroes

4 Sec. 7. (1) The department shall design license plates to be known as Down Syndrome Awareness License Plates. The design shall include the 5 words "Down syndrome awareness" inside a heart-shaped yellow and blue 6 7 ribbon. The design shall be selected on the basis of limiting the manufacturing cost of each plate to an amount less than or equal to the 8 9 amount charged for license plates pursuant to section 60-3,102. The 10 department shall make applications available for this type of plate beginning January 1, 2022. The department may adopt and promulgate rules 11 and regulations to carry out this section and section 8 of this act. 12

13 (2) One type of license plates under this section shall be
 14 alphanumeric plates. The department shall:

- 15 (a) Assign a designation up to five characters; and
- 16 <u>(b) Not use a county designation.</u>

17 (3) One type of license plates under this section shall be 18 personalized message plates. Such plates shall be issued subject to the 19 same conditions specified for personalized message license plates in 20 section 60-3,118, except that a maximum of five characters may be used.

(1) Beginning January 1, 2022, a person may apply to the 21 Sec. 8. 22 department for Down Syndrome Awareness License Plates in lieu of regular 23 license plates on an application prescribed and provided by the 24 department for any motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer, except for a 25 motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer registered under section 60-3,198. An applicant receiving a license plate under this section for a farm 26 27 truck with a gross weight of over sixteen tons or a commercial motor 28 vehicle registered for a gross weight of five tons or over shall affix the appropriate tonnage decal to the license plate. The department shall 29 30 make forms available for such applications through the county treasurers. Each application for initial issuance or renewal of Down Syndrome 31

Awareness License Plates shall be accompanied by a fee of forty dollars. 1 2 Fees collected pursuant to this subsection shall be remitted to the State 3 Treasurer. The State Treasurer shall credit sixty percent of the fees for 4 initial issuance and renewal of Down Syndrome Awareness License Plates to 5 the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund and forty percent of the fees 6 to the Highway Trust Fund. 7 (2) When the department receives an application for Down Syndrome Awareness License Plates, the department may deliver the plates and 8 9 registration certificate to the applicant by United States mail or to the 10 county treasurer of the county in which the motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer is registered and the delivery of the plates and registration 11 certificate shall be made through a secure process and system. The county 12 treasurer or the department shall issue plates under this section in lieu 13 of regular license plates when the applicant complies with the other 14 15 provisions of the Motor Vehicle Registration Act for registration of the motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer. If Down Syndrome Awareness 16 17 License Plates are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the licensee shall be

18 <u>issued replacement license plates upon request pursuant to section</u> 19 <u>60-3,157.</u>

(3)(a) The owner of a motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer bearing
 Down Syndrome Awareness License Plates may apply to the county treasurer
 to have such plates transferred to a motor vehicle, trailer, or
 semitrailer other than the motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer for
 which such plates were originally purchased if such motor vehicle,
 trailer, or semitrailer is owned by the owner of the plates.

26 (b) The owner may have the unused portion of the fee for the plates 27 credited to the other motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer that will 28 bear the plates at the rate of eight and one-third percent per month for 29 each full month left in the registration period.

30 (c) Application for such transfer shall be accompanied by a fee of
 31 three dollars. Fees collected pursuant to this subsection shall be
