A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; to amend section 37-327.03, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 60-301, 60-393, 60-395, 60-396, 60-3,104, and 60-3,130.04, Revised Statutes

Supplement, 2019; to change provisions relating to the Game and
Parks State Park Improvement and Maintenance Fund; to provide for
The Good Life Is Outside Plates; to harmonize provisions; and to
repeal the original sections.

8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 37-327.03, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
 is amended to read:

37-327.03 The Game and Parks State Park Improvement and Maintenance 3 Fund is created. The fund shall consist of transfers made by the 4 Legislature, money credited to the fund pursuant to section 9 of this 5 act, and any gifts, grants, bequests, or donations to the fund. Money in 6 7 the fund shall be used to build, repair, renovate, rehabilitate, restore, modify, or improve any infrastructure in the state park system. The 8 9 proceeds remitted to the fund pursuant to section 9 of this act shall be 10 used only for the improvement and maintenance of state recreational trails as defined in section 37-338. Any money in the fund available for 11 investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to 12 13 the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. 14

Sec. 2. Section 60-301, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is amended to read:

60-301 Sections 60-301 to 60-3,244 <u>and sections 8 and 9 of this act</u>
shall be known and may be cited as the Motor Vehicle Registration Act.
Sec. 3. Section 60-393, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is

20 amended to read:

60-393 Any owner who has two or more motor vehicles or trailers 21 22 required to be registered under the Motor Vehicle Registration Act may 23 register all such motor vehicles or trailers on a calendar-year basis or 24 on an annual basis for the same registration period beginning in a month 25 chosen by the owner. When electing to establish the same registration period for all such motor vehicles or trailers, the owner shall pay the 26 registration fee, the motor vehicle tax imposed in section 60-3,185, the 27 motor vehicle fee imposed in section 60-3,190, and the alternative fuel 28 fee imposed in section 60-3,191 on each motor vehicle for the number of 29 months necessary to extend its current registration period to the 30 registration period under which all such motor vehicles or trailers will 31

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be registered. Credit shall be given for registration paid on each motor 1 2 vehicle or trailer when the motor vehicle or trailer has a later expiration date than that chosen by the owner except as otherwise 3 4 provided in sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60 - 3, 128,60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,233, 60-3,235, 60-3,238, 60-3,240, 60-3,242, and 5 60-3,244 and section 9 of this act. Thereafter all such motor vehicles or 6 7 trailers shall be registered on an annual basis starting in the month chosen by the owner. 8

10 amended to read:

60-395 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this 11 section and sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128, 12 13 60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,231, 60-3,233, 60-3,235, 60-3,238, 60-3,240, 60-3,242, and 60-3,244 and section 9 of this act, the registration shall 14 expire and the registered owner or lessee may, 15 by returning the 16 registration certificate, the license plates, and, when appropriate, the 17 validation decals and by either making application on a form prescribed by the department to the county treasurer of the occurrence of an event 18 19 described in subdivisions (a) through (e) of this subsection or, in the case of a change in situs, displaying to the county treasurer the 20 registration certificate of such other state as evidence of a change in 21 situs, receive a refund of that part of the unused fees and taxes on 22 23 motor vehicles or trailers based on the number of unexpired months 24 remaining in the registration period from the date of any of the 25 following events:

26 (a) Upon transfer of ownership of any motor vehicle or trailer;
27 (b) In case of loss of possession because of fire, theft,
28 dismantlement, or junking;

(c) When a salvage branded certificate of title is issued;
(d) Whenever a type or class of motor vehicle or trailer previously

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registered is subsequently declared by legislative act or court decision

to be illegal or ineligible to be operated or towed on the public roads and no longer subject to registration fees, the motor vehicle tax imposed in section 60-3,185, the motor vehicle fee imposed in section 60-3,190, and the alternative fuel fee imposed in section 60-3,191;

5 (e) Upon a trade-in or surrender of a motor vehicle under a lease;6 or

7 (f) In case of a change in the situs of a motor vehicle or trailer8 to a location outside of this state.

9 (2) If the date of the event falls within the same calendar month in 10 which the motor vehicle or trailer is acquired, no refund shall be 11 allowed for such month.

(3) If the transferor or lessee acquires another motor vehicle at the time of the transfer, trade-in, or surrender, the transferor or lessee shall have the credit provided for in this section applied toward payment of the motor vehicle fees and taxes then owing. Otherwise, the transferor or lessee shall file a claim for refund with the county treasurer upon an application form prescribed by the department.

(4) The registered owner or lessee shall make a claim for refund or
credit of the fees and taxes for the unexpired months in the registration
period within sixty days after the date of the event or shall be deemed
to have forfeited his or her right to such refund or credit.

(5) For purposes of this section, the date of the event shall be:
(a) In the case of a transfer or loss, the date of the transfer or loss;
(b) in the case of a change in the situs, the date of registration in
another state; (c) in the case of a trade-in or surrender under a lease,
the date of trade-in or surrender; (d) in the case of a legislative act,
the effective date of the act; and (e) in the case of a court decision,
the date the decision is rendered.

(6) Application for registration or for reassignment of license
plates and, when appropriate, validation decals to another motor vehicle
or trailer shall be made within thirty days of the date of purchase.

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1 (7) If a motor vehicle or trailer was reported stolen under section 2 60-178, a refund under this section shall not be reduced for a lost plate 3 charge and a credit under this section may be reduced for a lost plate 4 charge but the applicant shall not be required to pay the plate fee for 5 new plates.

6 (8) The county treasurer shall refund the motor vehicle fee and 7 registration fee from the fees which have not been transferred to the 8 State Treasurer. The county treasurer shall make payment to the claimant 9 from the undistributed motor vehicle taxes of the taxing unit where the 10 tax money was originally distributed. No refund of less than two dollars 11 shall be paid.

Sec. 5. Section 60-396, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is amended to read:

60-396 Whenever the registered owner files an application with the 14 county treasurer showing that a motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer is 15 16 disabled and has been removed from service, the registered owner may, by 17 returning the registration certificate, the license plates, and, when appropriate, the validation decals or, in the case of the unavailability 18 19 of such registration certificate or certificates, license plates, or validation decals, then by making an affidavit to the county treasurer of 20 such disablement and removal from service, receive a credit for a portion 21 22 of the registration fee from the fee deposited with the State Treasurer at the time of registration based upon the number of unexpired months 23 24 remaining in the registration year except as otherwise provided in 25 sections 60-3,121, 60-3,122.02, 60-3,122.04, 60-3,128, 60-3,224, 60-3,227, 60-3,233, 60-3,235, 60-3,238, 60-3,240, 60-3,242, and 60-3,244 26 and section 9 of this act. The owner shall also receive a credit for the 27 28 unused portion of the motor vehicle tax and fee based upon the number of unexpired months remaining in the registration year. When the owner 29 registers a replacement motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer at the 30 time of filing such affidavit, the credit may be immediately applied 31

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against the registration fee and the motor vehicle tax and fee for the 1 2 replacement motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer. When no such replacement motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer is so registered, the 3 4 county treasurer shall forward the application and affidavit, if any, to 5 the State Treasurer who shall determine the amount, if any, of the allowable credit for the registration fee and issue a credit certificate 6 to the owner. For the motor vehicle tax and fee, the county treasurer 7 shall determine the amount, if any, of the allowable credit and issue a 8 9 credit certificate to the owner. When such motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer is removed from service within the same month in which it was 10 registered, no credits shall be allowed for such month. The credits may 11 be applied against taxes and fees for new or replacement motor vehicles, 12 trailers, or semitrailers incurred within one year after cancellation of 13 registration of the motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer for which the 14 credits were allowed. When any such motor vehicle, trailer, 15 or 16 semitrailer is reregistered within the same registration year in which its registration has been canceled, the taxes and fees shall be that 17 portion of the registration fee and the motor vehicle tax and fee for the 18 19 remainder of the registration year.

11 Sec. 7. Section 60-3,130.04, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2019, is 12 amended to read:

60-3,130.04 (1) An owner of a historical vehicle eligible for 13 14 registration under section 60-3,130 may use a license plate or plates designed by this state in the year corresponding to the model year when 15 16 the vehicle was manufactured in lieu of the plates designed pursuant to 17 section 60-3,130.03 subject to the approval of the department. The department shall inspect the plate or plates and may approve the plate or 18 19 plates if it is determined that the model-year license plate or plates are legible and serviceable and that the license plate numbers do not 20 conflict with or duplicate other numbers assigned and in use. 21 An original-issued license plate or plates that have been restored to 22 original condition may be used when approved by the department. 23

(2) The department may consult with a recognized car club in
determining whether the year of the license plate or plates to be used
corresponds to the model year when the vehicle was manufactured.

(3) If only one license plate is used on the vehicle, the license
plate shall be placed on the rear of the vehicle. The owner of a
historical vehicle may use only one plate on the vehicle even for years
in which two license plates were issued for vehicles in general.

31 (4) License plates used pursuant to this section corresponding to

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the year of manufacture of the vehicle shall not be personalized message 1 2 license plates, Pearl Harbor license plates, prisoner-of-war license plates, disabled veteran license plates, Purple Heart license plates, 3 4 amateur radio station license plates, Nebraska Cornhusker Spirit Plates, 5 handicapped or disabled person license plates, specialty license plates, special interest motor vehicle license plates, Military Honor Plates, 6 7 Nebraska 150 Sesquicentennial Plates, Breast Cancer Awareness Plates, Prostate Cancer Awareness Plates, Mountain Lion Conservation Plates, 8 9 Choose Life License Plates, Native American Cultural Awareness and 10 History Plates, Sammy's Superheroes license plates for childhood cancer awareness, The Good Life Is Outside Plates, Wildlife Conservation Plates, 11 or Support Our Troops Plates. 12

13 Sec. 8. (1) The department shall design license plates to be known as The Good Life Is Outside Plates. The design shall reflect the 14 15 importance of safe walking and biking in Nebraska and the value of our recreational trails. The design shall be selected on the basis of 16 17 limiting the manufacturing cost of each plate to an amount less than or equal to the amount charged for license plates pursuant to section 18 19 60-3,102. The department shall make applications available for this type of plate beginning October 1, 2020. The department may adopt and 20 21 promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this section and section 9 22 of this act.

23 (2) One type of The Good Life Is Outside Plates shall be
 24 alphanumeric plates. The department shall:

25 (a) Assign a designation up to five characters; and

26 <u>(b) Not use a county designation.</u>

27 (3) One type of The Good Life Is Outside Plates shall be
 28 personalized message plates. Such plates shall be issued subject to the
 29 same conditions specified for personalized message license plates in
 30 section 60-3,118, except that a maximum of five characters may be used.

31 Sec. 9. <u>(1) Beginning October 1, 2020, a person may apply to the</u>

1	department for The Good Life Is Outside Plates in lieu of regular license
2	plates on an application prescribed and provided by the department for
3	any motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer, except for a motor vehicle or
4	trailer registered under section 60-3,198. An applicant receiving a The
5	<u>Good Life Is Outside Plate for a farm truck with a gross weight of over</u>
6	sixteen tons or for a commercial motor vehicle registered for a gross
7	weight of five tons or over shall affix the appropriate tonnage decal to
8	the plate. The department shall make forms available for such
9	applications through the county treasurers. The license plates shall be
10	issued upon payment of the license fee described in subsection (2) of
11	this section.
12	(2)(a) In addition to all other fees required for registration under
13	the Motor Vehicle Registration Act, each application for initial issuance
14	or renewal of alphanumeric The Good Life Is Outside Plates shall be
15	accompanied by a fee of five dollars. County treasurers collecting fees
16	pursuant to this subdivision shall remit such fees to the State
17	Treasurer. The State Treasurer shall credit five dollars of the fee to
18	the Game and Parks State Park Improvement and Maintenance Fund for the
19	purpose of trail improvement and maintenance.
20	<u>(b) In addition to all other fees required for registration under</u>
21	the Motor Vehicle Registration Act, each application for initial issuance

22 or renewal of personalized message The Good Life Is Outside Plates shall 23 be accompanied by a fee of forty dollars. County treasurers collecting 24 fees pursuant to this subdivision shall remit such fees to the State Treasurer. The State Treasurer shall credit twenty-five percent of the 25 26 fee for initial issuance and renewal of such plates to the Department of 27 Motor Vehicles Cash Fund and seventy-five percent of the fee to the Game 28 and Parks State Park Improvement and Maintenance Fund for the purpose of 29 trail improvement and maintenance.

30 (3) When the department receives an application for The Good Life Is
 31 Outside Plates, the department may deliver the plates and registration

1	<u>certificate to the applicant by United States mail or to the county</u>
2	treasurer of the county in which the motor vehicle, trailer, or
3	semitrailer is registered and the delivery of the plates and registration
4	certificate shall be made through a secure process and system. The county
5	treasurer or the department shall issue The Good Life Is Outside Plates
6	in lieu of regular license plates when the applicant complies with the
7	other provisions of the Motor Vehicle Registration Act for registration
8	<u>of the motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer. If The Good Life Is</u>
9	Outside Plates are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the licensee shall be
10	issued replacement license plates upon request pursuant to section
11	<u>60-3,157.</u>

(4) The county treasurer or the department may issue temporary 12 13 license stickers to the applicant under this section for the applicant to lawfully operate the vehicle pending receipt of the license plates. No 14 15 charge in addition to the registration fee shall be made for the issuance 16 of a temporary license sticker under this subsection. The department 17 shall furnish temporary license stickers for issuance by the county treasurer at no cost to the counties. The department may adopt and 18 19 promulgate rules and regulations regarding the design and issuance of 20 temporary license stickers.

(5) The owner of a motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer bearing 21 22 The Good Life Is Outside Plates may apply to the county treasurer to have 23 such plates transferred to a motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer other 24 than the motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer for which such plates 25 were originally purchased if such motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer is owned by the owner of the plates. The owner may have the unused 26 27 portion of the fee for the plates credited to the other motor vehicle, 28 trailer, or semitrailer which will bear the plates at the rate of eight 29 and one-third percent per month for each full month left in the registration period. Application for such transfer shall be accompanied 30 by a fee of three dollars. Fees collected pursuant to this subsection 31

1 shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Department of 2 Motor Vehicles Cash Fund. 3 (6) If the cost of manufacturing The Good Life Is Outside Plates at any time exceeds the amount charged for license plates pursuant to 4 5 section 60-3,102, any money to be credited to the Game and Parks State 6 Park Improvement and Maintenance Fund shall instead be credited first to 7 the Highway Trust Fund in an amount equal to the difference between the 8 manufacturing costs of The Good Life Is Outside Plates and the amount 9 charged pursuant to section 60-3,102 with respect to such plates and the 10 remainder shall be credited to the Game and Parks State Park Improvement

11 <u>and Maintenance Fund for the purpose of trail improvement and</u> 12 maintenance.
