## AMENDMENTS TO LB1158

Introduced by Education.

3 Section 1. Section 79-530, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
4 amended to read:

5 79-530 The Legislature finds and declares:

6 (1) That parental involvement <u>of parents and guardians</u> is a key
7 factor in the education of children;

8 (2) That parents <u>or guardians</u> need to be informed of the educational
9 practices affecting their children; and

(3) That public schools should foster and facilitate <u>parents' and</u>
 <u>guardians' access to parental</u> information about, and involvement in,
 educational practices affecting their children.

It is the intent of the Legislature, through the enactment of sections 79-531 to 79-533<u>and sections 5, 6, and 7 of this act</u>, to strengthen the level of <del>parental</del> involvement and participation <u>by parents</u> <u>and guardians</u> in the public school system of the state.

17 Sec. 2. Section 79-531, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 18 amended to read:

79-531 On or before July 1, <u>2023</u> <del>1995</del>, each public school district
in the state shall develop and adopt a policy stating how the district
will seek to involve parents <u>and guardians</u> in the <u>education of their</u>
<u>children schools</u> and <u>the rights of each parent or guardian to:</u>

(1) Access what parents' rights shall be relating to access to the
 schools, testing information, and curriculum; and matters.

25 (2) Request that a child be excused from specific instruction or
 26 activities.

27 Sec. 3. Section 79-532, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

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1 amended to read:

79-532 (1) The policy required by section 79-531 shall include, but
need not be limited to, the following:

4 (a) (1) How the school district will provide access to parents or 5 guardians concerning textbooks;  $\tau$  tests; activities information; digital 6 materials; websites or applications used for learning; training materials 7 for teachers, administrators, and staff; procedures for the review and 8 approval of training materials, learning materials, and activities;  $\tau$  and 9 other curriculum materials used in the school district;

10 <u>(b)</u> <del>(2)</del> How the school district will <u>accommodate</u> <del>handle</del> requests by 11 parents <u>or guardians</u> to attend and monitor courses, assemblies, 12 counseling sessions, and other instructional activities;

13 (c) (3) Under what circumstances parents <u>or guardians</u> may ask that 14 their children be excused from testing, classroom instruction, <u>learning</u> 15 <u>materials</u>, <u>activities</u>, <u>guest speaker events</u>, and other school experiences 16 the parents <u>or guardians</u> may find objectionable;

17 <u>(d)</u> <del>(4)</del> How the school district will provide access to records of 18 students;

19 (e) (5) What the school district's testing policy will be; and

20 <u>(f)</u> <del>(6)</del> How the school district participates in surveys of students 21 and the right of parents <u>or guardians</u> to remove their children from such 22 surveys.

 of information in violation of the federal Family Educational Rights and
 Privacy Act of 1974, as amended, 20 U.S.C. 1232g, or any federal
 regulations and applicable guidelines adopted in accordance with such
 act, as such act, regulations, and guidelines existed on January 1, 2022.
 Sec. 4. Section 79-533, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

79-533 The policy required by section 79-531 shall be developed with
 parental input from parents and guardians and shall be the subject of a

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public hearing before the school board or board of education of the 1 school district before adoption by the board. The policy shall be 2 3 reviewed annually and either altered and adopted as altered or reaffirmed by the board following a public hearing. Any public hearing under this 4 5 section shall include a reasonable opportunity for public comments. 6 Sec. 5. By August 1, 2023, each school district shall make the 7 policy required by section 79-531 accessible on the school district's 8 public website. The policy shall be accessible by a prominently displayed 9 link on such website. If the policy is altered, the new version of the policy shall be made accessible within a reasonable time thereafter. 10

Sec. 6. <u>To the extent practicable, each public school district</u> <u>shall make a reasonable effort to make any learning materials, including</u> <u>original materials, available for inspection by a parent or guardian upon</u> <u>request.</u>

15 Sec. 7. If the Commissioner of Education determines that any school district has intentionally refused, in a material manner, to comply with 16 17 sections 79-531 to 79-533 and sections 5 and 6 of this act, the commissioner shall notify the school district of the noncompliance and 18 19 allow the school district a reasonable time to comply. If the 20 commissioner determines, after such time has elapsed, that the school 21 district is not in compliance and has not made a good faith attempt to 22 comply, the commissioner shall take appropriate remedial action within 23 the commissioner's authority, up to and including qualifying such 24 noncompliance as a violation of the rules and regulations for the accreditation of schools. 25
