Introduced by Education.

1. Strike the original sections and insert the following new 1 sections: 2 3 Sections 1 to 6 of this act shall be known and may be Section 1. cited as the School Safety and Security Reporting System Act. 4 5 Sec. 2. For purposes of the School Safety and Security Reporting 6 System Act: (1) Concerning behavior includes, but is not limited to, suicide, 7 8 bullying, stalking behavior, cyber or electronic harassment, bomb threat, 9 family violence, physical or sexual abuse, threat to property, behavior indicative of terrorism, assault or attack, inappropriate weapons use, 10 concern about mental health or substance use, sexual exploitation or 11 predation, and any direct or indirect threatening statement; 12 13 (2) Department means the State Department of Education or the state 14 school security director; (3) Mental health professional means a school psychologist, social 15 16 worker, or licensed mental health professional; (4) Report line staff means the staff of the Safe2HelpNE report line 17 as provided in subsection (4) of section 3 of this act; 18 19 (5) Safe2HelpNE report line means the reporting system established pursuant to section 3 of this act; 20 21 (6) Threat assessment means an evidence-based process to reduce potential risks and incidents of violence resulting in harm to one or 22 23 more persons or school property; and (7) Threat assessment team means a school-based team of at least 24 five members who have completed the training required pursuant to section 25 4 of this act and includes, but is not limited to, the principal or 26 principal's designee, a mental health professional, and a member of the 27

1 school staff. 2 Sec. 3. (1) The department shall establish the Safe2HelpNE report 3 line as a statewide, anonymous reporting system to support threat 4 assessment teams and reduce potential risks and incidents of violence 5 resulting in harm to self, others, or school property. 6 (2) The Safe2HelpNE report line shall be multi-modal to allow 7 students, school staff, parents, and community members to anonymously 8 report concerns and information about concerning behavior or possible 9 harm to persons or property by telephone call, mobile application, web site, or email without charge. The Safe2HelpNE report line shall be 10 11 available to any public or nonpublic school that has a threat assessment team and that maintains a current list of the contact information for at 12 13 least five team members designated to receive alerts from staff at any 14 time of the day or night. 15 (3) Except as otherwise required by law, the identity of any individual who contacts the Safe2HelpNE report line shall be confidential 16 17 and shall not be revealed. (4) The Safe2HelpNE report line shall be staffed seven days per week 18 19 and twenty-four hours per day by professionals trained to receive concerns, use de-escalation techniques to minimize law enforcement 20 21 involvement, and alert the appropriate threat assessment team for review, 22 assessment, and action to protect persons and property. The report line 23 staff shall also be trained in threat assessment and management

24 processes, suicide prevention, recognizing mental illness and emotional 25 disturbance, and applicable confidentiality and privacy laws. The report 26 line staff shall have access to clinical consultation and support seven 27 days per week and twenty-four hours per day from a licensed mental health 28 professional.

(5) The report line staff shall immediately alert the appropriate
 threat assessment team of any concern directly regarding a student,
 school staff member, or school property or that is likely to impact a

student, school staff member, or school property. If there is an
 immediate life safety concern, emergency services shall be contacted
 prior to any threat assessment team. Each alert shall be assessed by the
 threat assessment team receiving such alert.

5 (6) The department shall track and evaluate the effectiveness and 6 usage of the Safe2HelpNE report line. The report line staff shall report 7 the number of calls received, disposition of calls, referrals made to 8 threat assessment teams, and other metrics as determined by and in the 9 manner prescribed by the department.

<u>(7) Any information or material in the possession of the threat</u>
 <u>assessment team shall remain separate from educational records and shall</u>
 <u>be considered security records.</u>

Sec. 4. The department shall provide training for the members of any threat assessment team serving a public or nonpublic school. Such training shall provide the knowledge and skill to allow threat assessment teams to work collaboratively to conduct threat assessments, engage in crisis intervention, increase awareness of concerning behavior among school staff, students, and the public, and interrupt violence in the planning stage to thwart potential harm to persons and property.

20 Sec. 5. <u>It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate money</u> 21 <u>from the General Fund for the Safe2HelpNE report line for ten years. At</u> 22 <u>the end of the ten years, the department shall electronically report</u> 23 <u>cost-benefit data and recommendations regarding the continued viability</u> 24 <u>of the Safe2HelpNE report line to the Education Committee of the</u> 25 Legislature.

26 Sec. 6. <u>The department may adopt and promulgate rules and</u> 27 <u>regulations to carry out the School Safety and Security Reporting System</u> 28 <u>Act.</u>

Sec. 7. Section 79-2,144, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2020, is amended to read:

31 79-2,144 The state school security director appointed pursuant to

section 79-2,143 shall be responsible for providing leadership and
 support for safety and security for the public schools. Duties of the
 director include, but are not limited to:

(1) Collecting safety and security plans, required pursuant to rules 4 5 and regulations of the State Department of Education relating to 6 accreditation of schools, and other school security information from each 7 school system in Nebraska. School districts shall provide the state 8 school security director with the safety and security plans of the school 9 district and any other security information requested by the director, but any plans or information submitted by a school district may be 10 11 withheld by the department pursuant to subdivision (8) of section 12 84-712.05;

(2) Recommending minimum standards for school security on or before
January 1, 2016, to the State Board of Education;

(3) Conducting an assessment of the security of each public school
building, which assessment shall be completed by August 31, 2019;

17 (4) Identifying deficiencies in school security based on the minimum
18 standards adopted by the State Board of Education and making
19 recommendations to school boards for remedying such deficiencies;

(5) Establishing security awareness and preparedness tools and
 training programs for public school staff;

(6) Establishing research-based model instructional programs for
 staff, students, and parents to address the underlying causes for violent
 attacks on schools;

(7) Overseeing suicide awareness and prevention training in public
schools pursuant to section 79-2,146;

(8) Establishing tornado preparedness standards which shall include,
but not be limited to, ensuring that every school conducts at least two
tornado drills per year;

30 (9) Responding to inquiries and requests for assistance relating to
 31 school security from private, denominational, and parochial schools; and

(10) Recommending curricular and extracurricular materials to assist
 school districts in preventing and responding to cyberbullying and
 digital citizenship issues; and -

4 (11) Carrying out the department's responsibilities under the School
5 Safety and Security Reporting System Act.

6 Sec. 8. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2021.

7 Sec. 9. Original section 79-2,144, Revised Statutes Cumulative8 Supplement, 2020, is repealed.

9 Sec. 10. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
10 passed and approved according to law.
