5 It is the intent of the Legislature that all unexpended appropriation balances of the Federal Funds appropriated in this act 6 7 existing on June 30, 2023, be reappropriated for FY2023-24 to the 8 respective agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act.

9 It is the intent of the Legislature that of the Federal Funds 10 appropriated and reappropriated in this act only the amounts obligated by 11 June 30, 2024, be reappropriated for FY2024-25 to the respective 12 agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act.

Sec. 5. OPERATING AND ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES.
