Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 574 would amend a vehicle inspection statute to change which out-of-state individuals may perform a vehicle inspection for purposes of an application for a certificate of title. Current law directs a county treasurer to accept a certificate of inspection, approved by the superintendent, from an officer of an officer of a "state police agency of another state" unless the inspection is required under section 60-174 (which includes vehicles with salvage, previously salvaged, flood damaged, or manufacturer buyback titles). The bill expands this provision by striking "state police agency of another state" and replacing it with an officer of a "law enforcement agency certified in another state."

Section-by-Section Summary:

Section 1 would amend section 60-146 to by adding language to direct county treasurers to accept vehicle inspections conducted by an officer of a law enforcement agency certified in another state, and strike previous language providing country treasures should only accept inspections conducted by an officer of a state police agency of another state.

Section 2 would repeal the original section.
